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**ORDER REVOKING REGISTRATION**

The SECRETARY OF STATE OF MISSISSIPPI, by and through the undersigned designated representative, hereby issues this Order Revoking Registration against NEW LIFE INTERNATIONAL (“New Life”). In support hereof, he states the following:

**I. JURISDICTION.**

The Secretary of State is vested with the regulation of charitable organizations that solicits donations in the State of Mississippi pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. § 79-11-501, *et seq.* New Life is a charitable organization as defined by Miss. Code Ann § 79-11-501(a)(i) (“Act”), to-wit:

(A) Any person determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be a tax exempt organization pursuant to Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

New Life is a charitable organization as defined by the Act, and therefore subject to the Secretary of State’s regulatory authority. Therefore the Secretary of State finds that he has jurisdiction over the subject matter and the parties herein.

## **II. FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. On December 31, 2013, New Life filed for bankruptcy relief in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the Middle District of Tennessee.

2. On May 31, 2014, New Life's charitable registration expired with the Mississippi Secretary of State's Charities Division ("Division") because New Life failed to renew its registration.

3. On September 2, 2014, an Order for the Plan of Liquidation for New Life was entered. The Plan of Liquidation became effective October 9, 2014.

4. On November 9, 2015, the Division received documentation of New Life's request to withdraw its charitable registration in Mississippi. The documentation further stated that the Plan of Liquidation relieved New Life of taking any additional action to withdraw its charitable registration in the states in which it was registered.

## **III. APPLICABLE LAW**

5. Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-503(6) states that in no event shall a registered charitable organization continue to solicit contributions in or from this state after the date such organization should have filed, but failed to file, a renewal and the financial report in accordance with the requirements of §§79-11-501 through 79-11-529.

6. Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-509(1)(e) states that the Secretary of State shall deny, suspend, or revoke a registration or exemption if the applicant or registrant has violated or failed to comply with any provisions of the chapter or any rule or other thereunder.

7. Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-509(2) further states that the Secretary of State shall notify the applicant or licensee of his intent to deny, suspend, or revoke a license

and shall inform him of his right to request an administrative hearing within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notification.

#### IV. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

8. According to Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-503(6), in no event shall a registered charitable organization continue to solicit contributions in or from this state after the date such organization should have filed, but failed to file, a renewal and the financial report in accordance with the requirements of §§79-11-501 through 79-11-529. New Life has failed to file a renewal registration and financial report with the Division after its registration expired, and is therefore, in violation of this provision.

9. Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-509(1)(e), the Secretary of State shall deny, suspend or revoke a registration if the applicant or registrant has violated or failed to comply with any provisions of the chapter or any rule or other thereunder. New Life has failed to comply with the statute and file a renewal registration, and is therefore, in violation of this provision.


#### V. REVOCATION OF REGISTRATION

As provided in Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-509, the Secretary of State hereby orders the revocation of the registration of New Life International. Pursuant to Miss. Code Ann. §79-11-509 (2), New Life is hereby notified that this revocation shall become effective thirty (30) days after receipt unless a request for an administrative hearing is received by the Secretary of State before the expiration of thirty (30) days. In the event such written notice is not received within the thirty (30) day period of time, the Order Revoking Registration shall become effective.

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
