Publication of Notice of Poll Worker Training: Public notice of the time and location of poll manager training must be posted at the courthouse and published in a newspaper of general circulation five (5) days before the date of the training. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-239(1)(4)*)

17th Delivery of Returns: Deadline by which the County Election Commissions must transmit to MSOS their respective county's General and Special Election returns, including the certified recapitulation, statement of whole number of votes cast in the county and the whole number of votes cast in each precinct in the county for each candidate for each office. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-601, 23-15-603*)

Absentee Ballots must be mailed to all voters who submitted an application before absentee ballots for the Runoff Elections were available. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-715(a)*)

UOCAVA Absentee Ballots: Circuit Clerks' Offices send absentee ballots for the Runoff Elections by mail, email or fax to UOCAVA voters who have requested an absentee ballot by application, FPCA or FWAB. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-683, 23-15-691, 23-15-692, 23-15-699*)

Permanently Disabled Voters: Circuit Clerks' Office mail absentee ballots for the Runoff Elections to voters on the permanently disabled list. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-629(4)*)

18th Absentee Voting: Circuit Clerks' Offices **MUST** remain open from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. for in-person absentee voting in the Runoff Elections. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-653*)

21st Campaign Finance Deadline, 5:00 p.m.: Pre-Runoff Election Report due in the Circuit Clerks' Offices for special election candidates appearing on the General or Special Runoff Election ballot. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-807(b)(iii)*).

- 22nd** Poll Manager Training Deadline: No poll manager (or resolution board member) may serve in any election unless he/she has received training once during the 12 months immediately preceding the election. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-239(1)(a)*)
- 25th** In-Person Absentee Voting Deadline, 12:00 p.m.: Circuit Clerks' Office MUST remain open from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. for absentee voting in the Runoff Elections. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-653*)
- L & A Testing Deadline. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-531.4(4)(a)*)
- 27th** Absentee Ballot by Mail Deadline, 5:00 p.m.: Absentee ballots returned by mail MUST BE RECEIVED by the Circuit Clerks' Office no later than 5:00 p.m. This is not a postmark deadline but an actual receipt deadline. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-631(1)(c), 23-15-637*)
- 28th** **RUNOFF ELECTION DAY:** Consolidated/Consolidated Line School District Trustee and Municipal Separate School District Trustee; county and county district vacancies. Polls open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
- UOCAVA Absentee Ballot Deadline, 7:00 p.m.: Absentee ballots returned by UOCAVA voters MUST BE RECEIVED by the Circuit Clerks' Offices no later than 7:00 p.m. on Election Day. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-699*)
- 29th** Late Absentee Ballots: The absentee ballot applications and unopened absentee ballot envelopes received after the applicable deadline(s) must be stamped with the day and hour of receipt by the Circuit Clerks' Offices and retained for the period of time required for the preservation of ballots. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-647*)

DECEMBER

- 5th** Voter ID Affidavit Ballot Deadline, 5:00 p.m.: Last day affidavit voters who cast an affidavit ballot by reason of voter ID may present an acceptable form of photo ID or complete an affidavit of religious objection in the Circuit Clerk's Office. (*MS Const. 1890 § 249-A*)
- 8th** Canvass of Returns and Declaration of Runoff Election Results by County Election Commission: Deadline by which the County Election Commissions must transmit to MSOS their respective county's General and Special Runoff Election returns, including the certified recapitulation, statement of whole number of votes cast in the county and the whole number of votes cast in each precinct in the county, for each candidate for each office. (*Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-601, 23-15-603*)
