JANUARY

- 5th <u>Legislature</u>: Legislative session begins. (Miss. Code Ann. 5-1-7)
- 12th Purging: County Election Commissioners meet to purge rolls. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-153(1)(a)).
- 29th Campaign Finance: Annual reports due today no later than 5:00 p.m. in the appropriate office. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807(b)(iii) and (e)).

MARCH

1st <u>Qualifying Deadline</u>: Qualifying deadline for U.S. Senate and U.S. House of Representatives running in the 2010 primary and general

- election. Primary candidates pay fees and file statement of intent with proper executive committee. Independent candidates file qualifying petitions with the Secretary of State. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-299).
- 3^{rd} Purging/NVRA: Systematic purging activities must cease before the June 1 Primary Election. (42 U.S.C. 1973gg-6(c)(2)(A).
- 6th <u>Municipal School Trustee</u>: Election for this office in some counties. (*Miss. Code Ann. 37-7-215*)
- 20th <u>Municipal School Trustee-Added Territory</u>: Runoff election, where required, for this office in some counties. (*Miss. Code Ann. 37-7-215*)

APRIL

- 2nd Permanently Disabled Voters List: Circuit Clerks must deliver to the Election Commission the list of permanently disabled voters who receive absentee ballots automatically for the June 1 primary. The Election Commission is then charged with examining and maintaining the roll. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-629*(3))
- 5th *Legislative Session Ends*: sine die. (Miss. Const. 1890 §36)
- 12th State Executive Committee: Deadline for the state executive committee of each political party to furnish to each county executive committee the names of all state district candidates and a sample official ballot to be used in the June 1 Primary. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-331*)
- 17th Permanently Disabled Voters List: Deadline for Election Commission to return permanently disabled voters list to Circuit Clerk's office for the June 1 Primary election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-629(3)*) [Saturday]
- 19th <u>Absentee Balloting</u>: Absentee ballots should be available for voting in the primary election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-715*)
- 22nd Permanently Disabled Voters: Deadline for Circuit Clerks to mail absentee ballots to permanently disabled voters on file for the June 1 Primary election. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-629(4))

26th-30th <u>Voter Registration</u>: Circuit Clerks' offices may remain open from 8:00a.m. until 7:00 p.m., including the noon hour. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-37(2)*) Any change in hours of operation from the last election cycle must be precleared by the county from US Justice Department.

MAY

- 1st <u>Voter Registration</u>: Circuit Clerk's office must remain open this Saturday until noon for voter registration. Noon is also the deadline for Circuit Clerks to accept hand delivered mail-in voter registration applications. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-37(2)*) [Saturday].
- 7th Qualifying Deadline: Qualifying deadline for nonpartisan judicial offices, including county court judge. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-977)
- 10th Campaign Finance-Nonpartisan Judicial Offices: Periodic campaign finance disclosure report is due no later than 5pm in the appropriate office. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-815-807(c)*)
- 11th Poll Workers: Deadline for Executive Committee to appoint instructors for poll workers for June 1 primary election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-417*)
- 18th Poll Workers: Deadline for Executive Committee to appoint poll managers. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-265*)
- 22nd Absentee Ballots: Circuit Clerk's office must remain open until noon for absentee balloting. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-653*) [Saturday]
- 25th Campaign Finance: Campaign finance deadline for the pre-election reports for the June 1 Primary Election. All non-federal candidates in contested races, except for non-partisan judicial races, must submit these reports. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807(b)(i))
- 29th Absentee Ballots: Circuit Clerk's office must remain open until noon for absentee balloting. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-653 and 23-15-715(a)*) [Saturday]
- 31st Absentee Ballots: Deadline for receipt of mailed absentee ballots by

JUNE

- **PRIMARY ELECTION DAY**: Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-1031*)
- Mississippi Levee Commissioners General Election: A General Election in certain areas for Mississippi Levee Commissioners will also be held on this day. One office in each of the following counties: Bolivar, Humphreys, Sharkey, and Washington. (Gen. Laws 1930: Ch. 85; Gen Laws 1968: Ch. 574; and Gen. Laws 1983: Ch. 317)
- **10th** Campaign Finance-Nonpartisan Judicial Offices: Periodic campaign finance disclosure report is due no later than 5:00 p.m. in the appropriate office. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-815-807(c*))
- 12th <u>Absentee Ballots</u>: Circuit Clerk's offices open until noon for primary runoff absentee voting, if absentee ballots are available. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-653*) [Saturday]
- 15th Campaign Finance: Campaign finance deadline for the pre-election reports for the June 22 Primary Runoff Election. All non-federal candidates in contested races, except for non-partisan judicial races, must submit these reports. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807(b)(i))
- Absentee Ballots: Last day to vote by absentee ballot in the Circuit Clerk's office, which is open until noon, for the June 22nd primary runoff election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-631(1)(c) and 23-15-715(a)*) [Saturday]
- 21st Absentee Ballots: Mail-in ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. today, the day preceding the June 22 Primary Runoff Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-631(1)(c)*)
- 22nd Mississippi Levee District Run-off Election (if required.) Polls open 7am to 7pm. (Gen. Laws 1968, Chapter 574)
- 22nd PRIMARY RUNOFF ELECTION DAY: Polls open at 7:00 a.m.

and close at 7:00 p.m. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-1031*)

JULY

9th <u>Campaign Finance-Nonpartisan Judicial Offices</u>: Periodic campaign finance disclosure report is due no later than 5pm in the appropriate office. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807*)

AUGUST

- 4th <u>School Board Candidates</u>: First day in which a person can qualify as a candidate for a county school board member position. (*Miss. Code Ann. 37-5-9*) Today is the earliest date for consolidated school district trustee candidates to qualify. (*Miss. Code Ann. 37-7-225*)
- 4th Purging/NVRA: Systematic purging activities must cease before the November 2 General Election. (42 U.S.C. 1973gg-6(c)(2)(A).

SEPTEMBER

- 3rd School Board Candidates: Deadline for persons running for county school board member position to qualify. (*Miss. Code Ann. 37-5-9*). Deadline for consolidated school district trustee candidates to qualify. (*Miss. Code Ann. 37-7-225*).
- 3rd Special Election: Deadline for person to qualify for county and county-district special elections to fill vacancies. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-839)
- Permanently Disabled Voters List: Circuit Clerks must deliver the list of permanently disabled voters who receive absentee ballots automatically for the November 2 General Election to the Election Commission. The Election Commission is then charged with examining the roll for purposes of purging and maintenance. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-629(3))
- 13th <u>Purging</u>: County Election Commissioners meet to purge rolls. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-153.
- 18th Permanently Disabled Voters: Deadline for Election Commission to

- return the permanently disabled voters list to Circuit Clerk's office for the November 2 General Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-629(3)*) [Saturday]
- 20th Absentee Balloting: Absentee ballots should be available for voting in the general election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-715*)
- 23rd <u>Permanently Disabled Voters</u>: Last day for the Circuit Clerks to mail absentee ballots to disabled voters on the permanent list for the November 2 General Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-629(4)*)
- 27th 30th <u>Voter Registration</u>: Circuit Clerks' offices may remain open from 8:00a.m. until 7:00 p.m., including the noon hour. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-37(2)*) Any change in hours of operation from the last election cycle must be precleared by the county from US Justice Department.

OCTOBER

- Voter Registration: Circuit Clerks' offices may remain open from 8:00a.m. until 7:00 p.m., including the noon hour. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-37(2)*) Any change in hours of operation from the last election cycle must be precleared by the county from US Justice Department.
- 2nd <u>Voter Registration</u>: Circuit Clerk's office may remain open this Saturday until noon for voter registration. Noon is also the deadline for Circuit Clerks to accept hand delivered mail-in voter registration applications. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-37(2)) [Saturday]. Upon preclearance of House Bill 312 (2009 Regular Legislative Session), extended hours become mandatory.
- 3rd <u>Voter Registration Deadline for General Election</u>: Deadline for mailin voter registration forms to be postmarked when mailed to the Circuit Clerks' office for the November 2 General Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-47(2)(a)*) [Sunday]
 - **NOTE**: Since the legal 30 day deadline for mail-in voter registration forms falls on a Sunday, registration forms must be postmarked no later than Saturday, October 2, to accommodate those post offices which do not affix postmarks on Sundays.

- **10th** Campaign Finance-Nonpartisan Judicial Offices: Periodic campaign finance disclosure report is due no later than 5pm in the appropriate office. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807(c*))
- Absentee Voting: Circuit Clerk's office must remain open until noon for absentee voting. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-653*) [Saturday]
- 26th Campaign Finance: Campaign finance deadline for the pre-general election reports for the November 2 General Election. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807(b)(i))
- 30th Absentee Voting: Circuit Clerks' office must remain open until noon for absentee voting. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-653*) [Saturday]
- Absentee Ballots: Last day to vote by absentee ballot in the Circuit Clerk's office, which is open until noon, for the November 2 General Election. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-631(1)(c) and 23-15-715(a)) [Saturday]

NOVEMBER

- Absentee Ballots: Mailed absentee ballots must be received by 5:00 p.m. today, the day preceding the November 2 General Election. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-631(1)(c))
- 2nd GENERAL ELECTION: Polls open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 7:00 p.m. (*Miss. Const.*1890, §102; *Miss Code Ann.* 23-15-991)
- 2nd SPECIAL ELECTION: Regular Special Election (*Miss. Code Ann.* 23-15-833)
- 12th Election Returns: Deadline for County Election Commissioners to canvass returns from all voting precincts and transmit to the Secretary of State the election results. (*Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-603*)
- 16th Campaign Finance: Campaign finance deadline for the pre-runoff election reports for the November 23 General Election Runoff. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-807(b)(i))

23rd GENERAL ELECTION RUNOFF: (if required) Runoff for Nonpartisan Judicial Offices, certain other offices and special elections. (Miss. Code Ann. 23-15-981)
