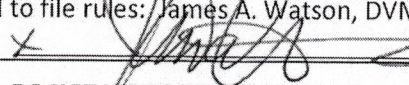

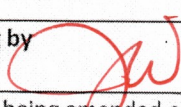

The ability to have a large scale stop movement order will help stop the spread of disease while surveillance and control measures are put into place.

Response: Highly contagious diseases are spread by animals, people and contaminated products. During an outbreak it may become necessary to limit or completely stop the movement of contaminated animals and animal products as part of the disease control measures.

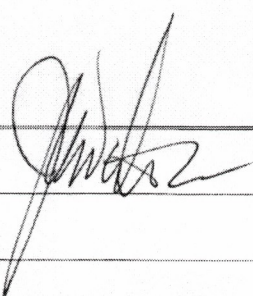
