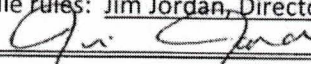

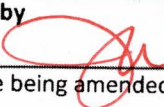

A. Estimated Costs and Benefits

1. Briefly summarize the benefits that may result from this regulation and who will benefit:

A permit is currently required for clearing and pruning of trees and other vegetation for construction of new utility lines. This regulation will benefit MDOT by requiring notification 24 hours prior to a utility company performing maintenance clearing and pruning for an existing utility line located on right-of-way. This regulation will benefit the utility by not requiring additional permits to be submitted when the utility wishes to perform maintenance operations to clear or prune trees and other vegetation which will not require traffic control or lane closures.

2. Briefly describe the need for the proposed rule:

The proposed rule will provide clarification on when additional permits may be required for the clearing and pruning of vegetation along existing utility lines on right-of-way. It also reinforces that all trees, brush, limbs and other debris must be removed from the right-of-way within the same day of the operation. The proposed rule addresses remnant patches or strips of trees and vegetation left after maintenance clearing and pruning operations completed by a utility. Additional clearing without reimbursement may be required by the District Engineer if potential safety issues exists or if removing remnant patches of timber or vegetation would reduce maintenance costs on the right-of-way.

3. Briefly describe the effect the proposed action will have on the public health, safety, and welfare:
The proposed action should enhance safety and aesthetics by ensuring that proper notification, traffic control, and removal of debris from right-of-way. It will further assist in reducing the overall maintenance costs incurred by MDOT with regard to maintaining roadsides in the vicinity of utility lines.
