- 1. Describe the need for the proposed action: This Administrative Code is being submitted to extend postpartum coverage for pregnant women from sixty (60) days to twelve (12) months to correspond with SPA 23-0015 Postpartum Coverage (effective 04/01/2023).
- 2. Describe the benefits which will likely accrue as the result of the proposed action: *Pregnant women will have twelve (12) months of postpartum coverage instead of sixty (60) days.*
- 3. Describe the effect the proposed action will have on the public health, safety, and welfare: It is anticipated that extending the postpartum coverage period to twelve (12) months will give pregnant women more time to receive medical care after pregnancy.

Estimate the cost to the agency and to any other state or local government entities, of implementing and enforcing the proposed action, including the estimated amount of paperwork, and any anticipated effect on state or local revenues: The expected annual increase in federal aggregate expenditures for Federal Fiscal Years 2023 (FFY23) and FFY24 have been included with Administrative Bulletin system number 27338.

Provide a detailed statement of the data and methodology used in making estimates required by this subsection: The state's contracted actuarial firm used actual membership from 2019 (pre-COVID) to estimate the number of postpartum member months for the additional 10 months of coverage. The cost per member month was estimated using utilization during the post-covid periods where members were continuously covered due to pandemic eligibility policies requiring all members to remain covered until the end of the Public Health Emergency. An increase of 2% was applied to account for rising healthcare costs. The actuaries reviewed the estimate in compliance with generally accepted actuarial practice and relevant actuarial standards of practice.
