WHEREAS it is necessary for the Occupational Licensing Review Commission to issue a resolution regarding the approval or denial of specific rules submitted for its review:
NOW, THEREFORE, LET IT BE RESOLVED BY THE OCCUPATIONAL LICENSING REVIEW COMMISSION, that the following rules shall be known to have been approved by the Commission at a duly called meeting of its members on September 30, 2025, and may now be filed as final with the Secretary of State's Office for inclusion in the Mississippi Administrative Code:

- Mississippi Board of Medical Licensure
 - Title 30 Miss. Admin. Code, Pt. 2635, Ch. 10: Maintenance, Production, and Release of Medical Records – Proposed revision to existing rules to reflect updates in statutory requirements for maintenance of patient records and imaging, and for condensing regulations in related filings to point to this chapter regarding maintenance of records.
 - Title 30 Miss. Admin. Code, Pt. 2625, Ch. 1 The Practice of Acupuncture, Rule 1.5: Patient Records – Proposed revision of the section of the rules related to patient records of licensed acupuncturist. This is an update to the requirements listed in this rule to reflect updates in statutory requirements for maintenance of patient records and imaging, and for condensing regulations in related filings to point to a single section (Part 2635, Ch. 10) regarding maintenance of records.
 - Title 30 Miss. Admin. Code, Pt. 2640, Ch. 1 Rules Pertaining to Prescribing, Administering and Dispensing of Medication, Rule 1.4: Maintenance of Records and Inventories – Proposed revision of the section of the prescribing rules related to maintenance of patient medical records. This is an update to the requirements listed in this rule to reflect updates in statutory requirements for maintenance of patient records and imaging, and for condensing regulations in related rule filings to point to a single chapter (Part 2635, Ch. 10) regarding maintenance of records.
 - Title 30 Miss. Admin. Code, Pt. 2640, Ch. 1 Rules Pertaining to Prescribing, Administering and Dispensing of Medication, Rule 1.10: Prescription Guidelines – Controlled Substances – Proposed revision to the section of the prescribing rules related to maintenance of patient medical records involving controlled substance prescriptions. This is an update to the requirements listed in this rule to reflect updates in statutory requirements for maintenance of patient records and imaging, and for condensing regulations in related rule filings to point to a single chapter (Part 2635, Ch. 10) regarding maintenance of records.

 - Title 30 Miss. Admin. Code, Pt. 2810, Rule 1.14: Qualifications for Military-Trained Medics Applying for NCLEX-PN – Proposed change to existing regulations to meet requirements recently set forth by Legislature's passing of HB 1262 that amended Miss. Code Ann. Section 73-15-21.
- Mississippi Board of Chiropractic Examiners
 - Title 30 Miss. Admin. Code, Pt. 2001, Chapters 1-23: Amendments to existing regulations for correction, clarification, and reorganization to provide clarity regarding licensure requirements, and disciplinary actions; creating an objective standard for the chiropractic/veterinarian relationship, additional licensing statuses, and a more complete program for chiropractic assistants and claims examiners.
