



Y'all Business Survey June 2019


The Secretary of State's Office is responsible for managing the corporate documents of LLCs, LPs, and corporations. Domestic businesses are surveyed on a variety of topics intermittently throughout the year. In the most recent installment (June 2019), more than 6,700 businesses responded. Results are used to address business needs and improve economic development tools like Y'all Business (www.yallbusiness.sos.ms.gov), a website developed by the Secretary of State's Office which offers free consumer and demographic information to burgeoning businesses. Results are shared with educational entities, business leaders, and economic development and state government stakeholders.



What percentage of your workforce "turns over" each year?










Have you given a raise to your employees in the past year?

Have you used ACT WorkKeys, or another talent assessment tool, to hire employees?











How would a minimum wage increase impact businesses in your community? Choose one.





How can we best equip students with the "soft skills" (communication, timeliness, integrity, etc.) necessary to enter the workforce? Choose one.







What is the approximate average age of your employees?




What is most helpful in determining whether a high school graduate can become a successful employee? Choose one.





What incentives are you offering employees to retain them? Check all that apply.


When there is an opening at your business, what is the primary way you find an employee to meet your business's needs? Choose one.








How many employees are currently employed at your company?






What qualities are most important in an educated workforce?




In which area could community and economic development entities most help your business?




How do you believe Mississippi businesses can best retain an educated workforce to work for your business?







How is your business connecting with K-12 schools, community colleges, or four-year universities to help create an educated workforce?











On a scale of 1 to 10, how technically skilled to your business are your newly hired employees (10 being the most skilled)?

Do you use any standardized tests to determine eligibility for employment?






Do you offer employees on-the-job training, tuition support, or other educational incentives?




When you need to hire an employee, how long does it generally






If you had an educated workforce, would you expand your business in Mississippi?







