2026 ELECTIONS CALENDAR

This calendar is provided for planning purposes only. Dates are subject to change or revision. Please refer to the proper citation in the Mississippi Code, the Mississippi Constitution, the United States Code and other cited sources for more complete legal requirements of the calendar entries posted below. Contact the Secretary of State's Office for updates or further information.

Mississippi election officials are required by State and Federal law to perform certain duties. This calendar is intended to serve only as an informational tool for election officials and the general public. Omission of any date does not relieve local election officials of their obligations to perform those duties as required by law.

Note: The regularly scheduled election for Mississippi Supreme Court is currently enjoined due to a federal court order.

JANUARY

1st HOLIDAY

Qualifying Period Begins: First day candidates may qualify for Court of Appeals, Chancery Court Judge, Circuit Court Judge, County Court Judge, and Mississippi Levee Commission. (Miss. Code Ann. §§ 23-15-299(3); 23-15-359(3) and (4); 23-15-977(1); (Section 2, Ch. 85 of the Laws of 1930, as amended by Section 1, Ch. 574 of the Laws of 1968; Section 1, Ch. 317 of the Laws of 1983) *NOTE*- This may vary for candidates

who qualify at the Circuit Clerk's Office as County's may choose to be closed this day in accordance with the Governor's October 16^{th} , 2025 proclamation. Candidates should contact their Circuit Clerk's Office before appearing to qualify on January 2^{nd} .

Permanently Disabled Voters List: Deadline for Circuit Clerk Offices to deliver to the Election Commissions the list of permanently disabled voters who receive absentee ballots automatically for the March 10, 2026, Primary Elections. (Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-629(3))

Absentee Ballot Applications: Absentee ballot applications are available in the Circuit Clerk's Office for the March 10, 2026, Primary Elections. (Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-625(1))

- **Deadline for State Executive Committees to Determine Qualifications:** State Executive Committees must make a final determination on the qualifications of each candidate who submitted the necessary qualifying paperwork by this date. (*Miss. Code Ann.. § 23-15-299(7)(b)(ii)*)
- 13th Voter Roll Maintenance: County Election Commissioners meet to conduct voter roll maintenance and purge ineligible voters from SEMS. (Miss. Code Ann.. § 23-15-153(1)(a))

NOTE: This date is within 90 days of a federal election – no systematic list maintenance may occur at this time. Voters may continue to be purged from the voter roll based upon death, conviction of disenfranchising crimes, adjudication of incompetence and voluntary request. (Miss. Code Ann.. § 23-15-152 (6))

19th HOLIDAY

<u>Primary Election Sample Ballot Deadline:</u> State Executive Committee provides the names of all qualified candidates to MSOS and MSOS publishes sample of official Primary Election Ballot in SEMS. (*Miss. Code Ann.. § 23-15-331*).

First UOCAVA Absentee Ballot Transmitted: Circuit Clerks' Offices send absentee ballots for the first and second Primary Elections to UOCAVA (Uniformed and Overseas Citizens) voters who requested an absentee ballot this calendar year, i.e., since Jan. 1, 2026. (Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-685)

Permanently Disabled Voter List: County Election Commission returns the updated list to the Circuit Clerk's Office. (Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-629(3))

- **In-Person** Absentee Ballots Available: Earliest day to vote by an in-person absentee ballot in the Circuit Clerk's Office in the Primary Election. (*Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-715*)

- 5th Poll Manager and Resolution Board Training Deadline: No poll manager or resolution board member may serve in any election unless he has received training once during the 12 months immediately preceding the election. (Miss. Code Ann. §23-25-239(1)).
- 7th <u>In-Person Absentee Voting Deadline, 12:00 p.m.</u>: Circuit Clerks' Offices OPEN from 8:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. (Miss. Code Ann. § 23-15-653)
