EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1044

Lowering of Flags in Honor of National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

WHEREAS, more than 2,400 Americans, including American Pacific Fleet military personnel, were killed during an unprovoked attack on Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, by Japanese forces during the Second World War; and

WHEREAS, these brave men and women made the ultimate sacrifice as a result of their dedicated service to the United States military, defending our nation in the face of this tragedy with resolve, determination, and courage; and


WHEREAS, December 7, 1941, should be remembered in our nation's history as a defining moment when the American military stepped forward to protect our freedom, preserve our liberty, and secure the future of democracy for the United States and nations around the world;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby proclaim a day of official remembrance in the State of Mississippi and do hereby order all flags of the State of Mississippi to be flown at half-staff from sun-up to sun-down on all buildings and grounds of the State of Mississippi and all areas under its jurisdiction on December 7, 2010, in honor of the individuals in service of America's military forces who died as a result of their service at Pearl Harbor.

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WHEREAS, these inmates satisfactorily performed services for the citizens of Mississippi, and the State's policy is to encourage rehabilitation and a sense of public responsibility on the part of inmates, and to provide urgently needed assistance during emergency situations.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this

State, do hereby grant to the above named individuals, as reflected by the work schedule maintained by the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections, ten days executive good time for each day worked, not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days. Persons under sentence for life are prohibited from having time applied toward parole eligibility.

All executive good time granted by this Order will count toward parole and/or discharge.

This executive good time is granted at the request of the Department of Corrections and is based upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections.

I authorize and direct you, upon receipt of this Order, to take notice and be governed accordingly.


WHEREAS, the prayers of this State are with the family and friends of Commissioner Minor;



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1040

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi is expected to be adversely affected by Tropical Storm Bonnie, which may include damaging winds, severe thunderstorms, flooding and possible tornadoes that are expected to occur over wide areas of Mississippi, and which may require sheltering of evacuees from other states; and thus state assistance will be necessary to support local government response and recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, civil authorities will require support from the Mississippi National Guard to cope with said emergency:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Phil Bryant, Acting Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-7-301, 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby direct Major General William Freeman, Adjutant General of the Mississippi National Guard, to order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi National Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to assist state and local civil authorities. Major General Freeman will be in direct Command of the troops ordered to active duty and will use such equipment as may be found necessary in his opinion to accomplish the support mission of the Mississippi National Guard troops. The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges, and immunities of the State of Mississippi, including those governing the National Guard. Major General Freeman is authorized to request and accept such federal funding as may be available for the Mississippi National Guard under Title 32 of the United States Code and otherwise.

FURTHER, the pay and expenses of the troops ordered to State Active Duty shall be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-313, 33-7-315 and 33-9-15, Mississippi Code of 1972, unless said pay and expenses are borne by the United States of America, pursuant to Title 32 of the United States Code or otherwise. All costs will be reimbursed as authorized by Section 33-15-307(4)(g), the Disaster Assistance Act of 1993, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, and/or other applicable Mississippi or federal law.

WHEREAS, civil authorities will require support from the Mississippi National Guard to cope with said emergency:





EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1037

WHEREAS, on the morning of April 24, 2010, Mississippi was struck by several tornadoes and other severe weather, cutting a wide swath of destruction; and

WHEREAS, this severe weather system caused great devastation to human life and property in Choctaw, Desoto, Forrest, Holmes, Jefferson Davis, Jones, Lamar, Lauderdale, Marion, Marshall, Oktibbeha, Simpson, Tallahatchie, Union, Warren, Webster and Yazoo Counties with at least ten deaths, multiple injuries and hundreds of homes damaged or destroyed by this storm that traveled at least 150 miles across the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, emergency response crews, law enforcement, fire and rescue officials, and residents across the State of Mississippi exhibited great courage, generosity, resilience and a willingness to selflessly help neighbors in need; and

WHEREAS, on April 20, 2010, an oil rig located in the Gulf of Mexico exploded, resulting in serious injuries to several crew members and causing the rig to sink; eleven crew members are missing and presumed dead, among those are residents of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, following these tragic events affecting our State, this week is an appropriate time to memorialize the lives lost; and

WHEREAS, the prayers of the people of the State are with the families and friends of the victims of the tornadoes and the oil rig explosion; and



WHEREAS the State of Mississippi has been and is expected to be further adversely affected by a severe weather system which is expected to occur over wide areas of Mississippi including, but not limited to Choctaw, Desoto, Forrest, Holmes, Jefferson Davis, Jones, Lamar, Lauderdale, Marion, Marshall, Oktibbeha, Simpson, Tallahatchie, Union, Warren, Webster and Yazoo counties and other affected areas; and state assistance will be necessary to support local government response and recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, civil authorities will require support from Mississippi National Guard to cope with said emergency:


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-7-301, 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby direct Major General William Freeman, Adjutant General of the Mississippi Guard, to order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to assist state and local civil authorities. Major General Freeman will be in direct Command of the troops ordered to active duty and will use such equipment as may be found necessary in his opinion to accomplish the support mission of the National Guard troops.

The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges, and immunities of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard.

FURTHER, the pay and expenses of the troops ordered to State Active Duty shall be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-313, 33-7-315 and 33-9-15. All costs will be reimbursed as authorized by Section 33-15-307 4(g), the Mississippi Emergency Act of 1995, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

WHEREAS, after making significant reductions to the division's administrative budget, and collecting as yet uncollected assessments for FY09, it will still be necessary to reduce the division's total expenditures, and

WHEREAS, the Governor has consulted the Executive Director regarding the implementation of program discontinuations and cost containment proposals to ensure the division's budget remains in balance as required by law:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, including Miss. Code. Ann. § 43-13-117, as amended, do hereby order and direct as follows:

1. The division shall increase the hospital assessment in an amount that represents twenty-five percent of the total state share expenditures to providers as required by Miss. Code Ann. § 43-13-117, as amended (currently \$2,369,691).
2. The division shall also enact State Plan Amendments to achieve the necessary savings from other Medicaid providers as demonstrated in the spreadsheet attached hereto and included herein by reference.
3. The division shall make such other reductions or adjustments that are not prohibited by state or federal law as are necessary for the implementation of this order.







EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1031

WHEREAS, Education is the number one economic-development and quality-of-life issue in Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, We must constantly seek ways to improve the quality of education our children receive, and the efficiency with which it is delivered; and,

WHEREAS, Our current system of K-12 administration is inefficient, with 152 school districts across only 82 counties; and,

WHEREAS, Reducing the total number of school districts from 152 to a smaller number will both improve educational quality and save money during these difficult economic times:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of this state, do hereby promulgate the following executive order, effective immediately.

There is hereby created and established an advisory council to be known as the Commission on Mississippi Educational Structure. It shall be the responsibility of the Commission on Mississippi Educational Structure to review Mississippi's current structure of school districts and recommend how they can be consolidated in order to improve both the quality of education and the efficiency with which it is delivered.

It shall further be the responsibility of the Commission on Mississippi Educational Structure to recommend how consolidation can best be achieved, and to calculate the savings that would result from consolidation.

The Commission shall have the authority to raise and to expend non-state funds, and to contract with outside consultants to advise the Commission, and to contract for such other services as the Commission deems necessary.

The Mississippi Department of Education shall provide staff and such other support as the Commission deems appropriate.

The Commission shall consist of not less than ten members appointed by the Governor to serve at his will and pleasure.

The Governor shall designate one member of the Commission to serve as its Chairman and another member to serve as its Vice Chairman, each of whom shall hold such position at the will and pleasure of the Governor. The Chairman or his designee has the exclusive authority to convene the Commission.

The Commission shall provide a recommendation not later than Monday, April 1, 2010, or another date specified by the Governor. The recommendation shall detail standards and priorities to be used by the State Board of Education in selecting those school districts to consolidate. Although the Governor has recommended reducing the total number of school districts to 100, the Commission shall have the authority to recommend consolidating to a greater or lesser number of districts.

The report shall further detail how best to implement consolidation, and shall make any other recommendations on how to maximize educational quality while eliminating duplicative and wasteful administrative spending.

Any executive orders relating to the subject matter hereof and contrary hereto are hereby superseded by this order.







EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1028

Relating to the Designation of the Governor's State Early Childhood Advisory Council

WHEREAS, compelling research supports the lifelong importance of early childhood development; and

WHEREAS, sound economic evidence indicates that smart investments in early childhood education yield long term gains by improving the quality of the future workforce and creating significant cost savings for society; and

WHEREAS, the early development and education of young children is of critical importance to Mississippi's families and communities; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi recognizes the importance of early childhood education and development programs and services for children from birth to school entry; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi has a need for coordination and collaboration among Federal, State, and local child care and early childhood education programs and initiatives to maximize resources; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi's families and children need a coordinated system of quality care and education with comprehensive supports to enable school success and lifelong learning; and

WHEREAS, the Federal Government, in the reauthorization of Head Start in Public Law 110-134 (Improving Head Start for School Readiness Act of 2007), has required states to have Advisory Councils dedicated to early education and care issues;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State do hereby:

- (A) Designate the existing State Early Childhood Advisory Council of Mississippi (herein referred to as the "Council") as the State Advisory Council on Early Childhood Education and Care for children from birth to school entry;
- (B) Locate the Council in the Office of the Governor to ensure access to the Governor and other key policy makers;
- (C) Designate leadership to coordinate the activities of the Council as described in PL110-134;
- (D) Appoint members to the Council in accordance with Public Law 110-134. Members of the Council shall include, to the extent possible—
 - (i) a representative of the Mississippi Department of Human Services;
 - (ii) a representative of the Mississippi Department of Education;
 - (iii) a representative of local educational agencies;
 - (iv) a representative of Mississippi Institutions of Higher Education;
 - (v) a representative of local providers of early childhood education and care services;

- (vi) a representative from Head Start agencies located in the State, including Indian Head Start programs and migrant and seasonal Head Start programs as available;
- (vii) the State Director of Head Start Collaboration;
- (viii) the Part C Coordinator and/or the Section 619 Coordinator of programs under the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. 1419, 1431 et seq.);
- (ix) a representative of the Mississippi Department of Health;
- (x) a representative of the Mississippi Department of Mental Health; and
- (xi) representatives of other entities deemed relevant by the Governor;

(E) Direct the Council to build on the existing early care and education system and to develop a strong infrastructure supporting collaboration, coordination, and equitable access to quality services and supports;

(F) Direct the Council to carry out the duties and functions specified in Public Law 110-134, including:

- (i) periodically conducting a statewide needs assessment concerning the quality and availability of early childhood education and development programs and services for children from birth to school entry, including assessing the availability of high-quality pre-kindergarten services for low-income children in Mississippi;
- (ii) identifying opportunities for, and barriers to, collaboration and coordination among Federally-funded and State-funded child development, child care, and early childhood education programs and services, including collaboration and coordination among State agencies responsible for administering such programs;
- (iii) developing recommendations for increasing the overall participation of children in existing Federal, State, and local child care and early childhood education programs, including outreach to underrepresented and special populations;
- (iv) developing recommendations regarding the establishment of a unified data collection system for early childhood education and development programs and services throughout Mississippi;
- (v) developing recommendations regarding statewide professional development and career advancement plans for early childhood educators in Mississippi;
- (vi) assess the capacity and effectiveness of 2- and 4-year public and private institutions of higher education in Mississippi toward supporting the development of early childhood educators, including the extent to which such institutions have in place articulation agreements, professional development and career advancement plans, and practice or internships for students to spend time in a Head Start or prekindergarten program; and
- (vii) make recommendations for improvements in the State Early Learning Guidelines and undertake efforts to develop high quality comprehensive early learning standards, as appropriate.

(G) Direct the Council to hold public hearings and/or provide opportunities for public comment on the activities described above in accordance with Public Law 110-134; and

(H) Direct the Council to submit a statewide strategic report addressing Council activities to the State Director of Head Start Collaboration and the Governor, in accordance with Public Law 110-134; and

(I) Direct the Council to meet periodically to review the implementation of recommendations contained in the statewide strategic report and to address any changes in State and local needs, in accordance with Public Law 110-134.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1027

TO THE COMMISSIONER OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS:

WHEREAS, LARRY ROBY, Mississippi Department of Corrections No. 83102, was sentenced in Cause Number 9764 in Attala County, Mississippi on September 20, 1993, to serve concurrent life sentences on two counts of murder; and was sentenced in Cause Number 5737-D in Rankin County, Mississippi, on September 12, 1997 to serve a consecutive one year sentence on a charge of Accessory Before the Fact to Racketeering; and,

WHEREAS, LARRY ROBY, became a trusty and was transferred to the Governor's Mansion, where he proved to be a diligent and dedicated workman.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of this State, do hereby grant to **LARRY ROBY**, No. 83102, an indefinite suspension of sentence, pending his future good behavior and on condition that same may be revoked at any time, without notice or hearing, for violation of any of the conditions set out by the Mississippi Department of Corrections or for any reason deemed sufficient by the Governor in his sole discretion.

LARRY ROBY shall be under the supervision of the Mississippi Department of Corrections during and throughout the period of this suspension of sentence as though on parole and all rules and regulations shall apply; and, by accepting this suspension of sentence, **LARRY ROBY** agrees to be bound by all of its provision and conditions.

This indefinite suspension of sentence shall become effective and commence on September 27, 2009, at 7:00 A.M., Central Standard Time, and I reserve the right to rescind, revoke, amend, or modify this Executive Order, both before and after that date and time.



Executive Order No. 1026

WHEREAS, the Association of Community Organizations for Reform Now, or ACORN, maintains an office in the State of Mississippi and has conducted activities within the state, including some activities funded through taxpayer dollars; and

WHEREAS, reports have surfaced regarding illicit activities performed by ACORN; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Census Bureau has severed all ties to ACORN and Congress has voted to deny federal funds to ACORN; and

WHEREAS, ACORN is being investigated by at least 20 states, and the Internal Revenue Service is conducting a thorough review of its relationship with ACORN; and

WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon the Governor to steadfastly protect public money, and prevent its potentially being spent in furtherance of immoral, unethical or illegal activities:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of this State, do hereby order and direct:

That the State Fiscal Officer conduct a comprehensive review of Mississippi's relationship with the ACORN organization and provide a report to me of any payments made or scheduled to be made to ACORN; and

That all state agencies comply without hesitation with the investigative review ordered above; and

That all state agencies are hereby prohibited from entering into any contracts with ACORN or its subsidiaries or affiliates; and

That all state agencies are hereby ordered to cease funding for any current contracts with ACORN or its subsidiaries or affiliates to the extent permitted by law. If it is determined that such funding cannot legally be terminated, this determination shall be communicated in writing to the Governor, and any such contract shall be terminated or not renewed as soon as legally possible.



NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby proclaim a period of official mourning in the State of Mississippi and further do hereby order the flag of the State of Mississippi and the flag of the United States of America be flown at half-staff on all buildings and grounds of the State of Mississippi and all areas under its jurisdiction beginning at sunrise and ending at sunset on September 11, 2009.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1024

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi participates in the Medicaid program to provide health and wellness services to qualifying populations; and

WHEREAS, expert advice is valuable in policy formulation and implementation of the Medicaid program:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the Constitution and laws of this state, do hereby promulgate the following executive order, effective immediately.

There is hereby created and established an advisory council to be known as the Medicaid Hospital Advisory Board. It shall be the responsibility of the Medicaid Hospital Advisory Board to review those issues which the Governor or the Division of Medicaid submits to the Board and to comment on them to the Governor or the Division of Medicaid, in accordance with this executive order.

The Board shall consist of nine members, who shall be appointed by the Governor and shall serve at his will and pleasure.

The Governor shall designate one member of the Board to serve as its Chairman, who shall hold that post at the will and pleasure of the Governor. The Chairman has the exclusive authority to convene the Board, provided, however, that the Board may only convene in response to a request by the Governor or the Division of Medicaid.

In the event the Governor or the Division of Medicaid seeks the Board's review of an issue, the Governor or the Division of Medicaid shall submit a plain statement of the issue, along with any relevant attachments, and request the Board to review it. The Board shall have ten business days from the submission of the issue to review it unless the Governor or the Division of Medicaid specifies a different period of time for review. If the Governor or the Division of Medicaid specifies a different period of time to review an issue, the Board shall review it within the specified review period.

At the conclusion of the review period, the Chairman shall submit in writing to the Governor or the Division of Medicaid comments on the issue, which shall be adopted by not less than five members of the Board. If no five members agree on a specific comment, the Chairman shall submit a written comment on behalf of the Board summarizing the majority and minority views.

If the issue submitted to the Board is a proposed state plan amendment (SPA) to be submitted to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS), this paragraph applies. Once the Board's comment has been received, the Governor or the Division of Medicaid, in their exclusive discretion, may submit additional questions to the Board, alter the proposed SPA and resubmit it to the Board for new comment, or submit the SPA to CMS notwithstanding any comment from the Board.

Nothing contained herein is intended to in any way impair or delegate the constitutional and statutory duties or prerogatives of the Governor and the Division of Medicaid to administer the Medicaid program. The Board's comments shall be

advisory only, and the Governor and the Division of Medicaid retain all authority to administer the Medicaid program according to law.

Any executive orders relating to the subject matter hereof and contrary hereto are hereby superseded by this order.


