## EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1353

**WHEREAS**, on Friday, April 3, 2015, Mississippi lost a respected member of the Judiciary, with the death of Daniel Hendrick “Dan” Fairly, Chancery Court Judge of Rankin County; and

**WHEREAS**, Dan Fairly is survived by Jennifer Jones Fairly, his wife of thirty-six years, his son, Daniel Hendrick Fairly, Jr., his daughter, Christina Fairly Burrage, a grandson and granddaughter and numerous other family members; and

**WHEREAS**, Judge Fairly attended Jackson Prep and graduated from Belhaven College in 1978 and the University of Mississippi Law School in 1981; and

**WHEREAS**, Judge Fairly was a member of Lakeside Presbyterian Church in Brandon, Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, the prayers of this State are with the family and friends of Judge Dan Fairly:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Phil Bryant, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby proclaim a period of official mourning in the State of Mississippi and do hereby order the State Flag on all local and state buildings and grounds in Rankin County, Mississippi, fly at half-staff, beginning at noon and ending at sunset on Monday, April 6, 2015, in remembrance of a dedicated member of the Mississippi Judiciary, Chancery Judge Daniel Hendrick “Dan” Fairly.
