**EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1366**

**WHEREAS**, on Friday, October 2, 2015, Governor Phil Bryant issued Executive Order 1365 ordering the flags of the United States of America and the State of Mississippi be flown at half-staff on all public buildings and grounds and areas under the state's jurisdiction in honor of the victims of the October 1, 2015 shooting rampage on the campus of Umpqua Community College in Roseburg, Oregon; and

**WHEREAS**, the flags were ordered to be flown at half-staff from noon on Friday, October 2, 2015, until sunset on Monday, October 5, 2015; and

**WHEREAS**, later on October 2, 2015, President Barrack Obama issued a proclamation ordering the flag of the United States be flown at half-staff on all public buildings and grounds and other facilities until sunset on Tuesday, October 6, 2015:

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Phil Bryant, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby order that the time previously ordered for the flags of the United States of America and the State of Mississippi to be flown at half-staff on all buildings and grounds of the State of Mississippi and all areas under its jurisdiction be extended until sunset on Tuesday, October 6, 2015.
