EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1454

WHEREAS, on Monday, December 2, 2019, Mississippi lost a respected leader and devoted public servant with the passing of Nielsen Harris Cochran at the age of 78; and

WHEREAS, Nielsen Cochran was born on January 14, 1941, in Pontotoc, Mississippi, and grew up in Byram; and

WHEREAS, he attended Mississippi College and Northern State College in South Dakota; and

WHEREAS, Nielsen was a sweet-swinging, smooth-fielding third baseman with the Baltimore Orioles organization where he worked his way through the farm system until his final season at Triple-A Rochester in 1965; and

WHEREAS, in 1977, he was elected as Jackson City Commissioner, serving two terms; and

WHEREAS, in 1983, Nielsen Cochran was elected to the Mississippi Public Service Commission from the Central District and served as Commissioner for 24 years; and

WHEREAS, Nielsen is the son of the late W.H. Cochran and Emma Grace Cochran and brother to United States Senator Thad Cochran who died in May of 2019; and

WHEREAS, the prayers of this state are with his wife Connie and their sons Scot and Jason; his daughters Karen and Kirsten; his grandchildren and great-grandchildren; and other family members and many friends:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Phil Bryant, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby proclaim a period of official mourning in the State of Mississippi and do hereby order all flags of the United States of America and the State of Mississippi be flown at half-staff on all buildings and grounds of the State of Mississippi and all areas under its jurisdiction from sunrise to sunset on Friday, December 6, 2019, in remembrance of a dedicated Mississippi public servant and a good man, Nielsen Harris Cochran.
