### EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 1574

**WHEREAS**, Mississippi mourns the passing of Michael Elaine “Mike” Griffin, a decorated Marine and distinguished law enforcement officer who lost his life in the line of duty on September 4, 2023, at the age of 62; and

**WHEREAS**, Officer Griffin, the son of the late Sylvesta Elaine and Martha Criswell Griffin was born on July 13, 1961, in Ripley, Mississippi; and

**WHEREAS**, Officer Griffin was a 1979 graduate of Ripley High School, and he continued his education at Northeast Mississippi Community College; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1980, Officer Griffin enlisted in the United States Marine Corps and proudly served his country as a Rifleman and Remote Sensor Specialist until 1986; and

**WHEREAS**, led by his spirit of adventure and public service, in 1987, Officer Griffin joined the Mississippi Highway Patrol and served with distinction first as a State Trooper and then as an Agent with the Mississippi Bureau of Investigations for thirty-four years; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 2, 1990, Officer Griffin married the love of his life, the former Edna Huddleston of Falkner, and the couple were blessed with a beautiful daughter, Olivia; and

**WHEREAS**, on June 30, 2021, Officer Griffin was assigned as the Government Affairs Liaison for the Mississippi Department of Public Safety, a position he held until his untimely death; and

**WHEREAS**, Officer Griffin was a man of immense character and kindness, a pillar of his church and community and beloved by all who knew him; and

**WHEREAS**, Officer Griffin’s dedication and heart for public service is best summed up in the words of Governor Tate Reeves: “I’m not in the least bit surprised he was on the side of the road trying to help someone in need—because that was just the kind of person he was. All day and every day. . . a Marine, a State Trooper, a servant of God, and just an all-around good dude”; and


**WHEREAS**, the outpouring of love and support following the tragic death of this fallen hero reflects the deep appreciation and gratitude of all Mississippians for Officer Griffin and the law enforcement community; and

**WHEREAS**, the prayers of this State are with Officer Griffin’s wife and daughter; one brother, Ricky Griffin; two half-sisters, Diane Cost (David) and Nina Lowry (Paul); a host of nieces, nephews, other family members; his canine companion “Jake” and feline friend, “Belle”; and many friends and the law enforcement community.

**NOW, THEREFORE**, I, Tate Reeves, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, and 4 USC § 7(m) do hereby proclaim a day of official mourning in the State of Mississippi in memory of Officer Michael Elaine “Mike” Griffin and direct that all flags of the United States of America and the State of Mississippi be flown at half-staff on all buildings and grounds of the State of Mississippi and all areas under its jurisdiction beginning at sunrise and ending at sunset on Saturday, September 9, 2023. Mike will be remembered as a wonderful and loving husband and father, for his exceptional friendliness and kindness, and for the many positive contributions he made to the Great State of Mississippi.
