





WHEREAS, these inmates satisfactorily performed services for the citizens of Mississippi, and the State's policy is to encourage rehabilitation and a sense of public responsibility on the part of inmates, and to provide urgently needed assistance during emergency situations.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State, do hereby grant to the above named individuals, as reflected by the work schedule maintained by the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections, fifteen days executive good time for each day worked, not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days. Persons under sentence for life are prohibited from having time applied toward parole eligibility.

All executive good time granted by this Order will count toward parole and/or discharge.

This executive good time is granted at the request of the Department of Corrections and is based upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections.



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 758

GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE ON COUNTY JAILS

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi desires to establish and promote standards to assist the counties of this state to improve operating procedures and practices in the County Jails; and

WHEREAS, issues regarding the adequacy and safety of County Jail facilities and the training of personnel have been raised in various forums and proceedings and should be addressed in a comprehensive manner; and

WHEREAS, the improvement in the operation of the County Jails in Mississippi can best be addressed by a Task Force of interested and knowledgeable citizens and certain State and County officials:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby order the formation of the Governor's Task Force on County Jails, effective as of October 26, 1994:

SECTION I:

The Task Force shall be composed of the following members:

1. A representative of the Sheriff's Association;
2. A representative of the Supervisor's Association;
3. A representative of the State Department of Mental Health;
4. A representative of the State Department of Public Safety;
5. A representative of the Governor's Office;
6. A representative of the Attorney General's office;
7. A representative of the Chancery Court Judge's Association;
8. A representative of the Circuit Court Clerk's Association;
9. Three members of the Mississippi State Senate; and
10. Three members of the Mississippi House of Representatives.

The Task Force shall remain in existence for a period of nine (9) months, from October 26, 1994 through July 26, 1995.

The Chairman of the Task Force shall be H. M. (Maurice) Hooks, Sheriff of Jones County, Mississippi.

The Chairman may, from time to time, invite a representative of the State Chief Deputy Fire Marshall and other parties and officials to participate in the meetings of the Task Force.

SECTION II:

1. The members of the Task Force shall be appointed by the Governor, and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The members of the Task Force shall serve without compensation, but shall be reimbursed on a mileage basis for travelling expenses to and from scheduled meetings of the Task Force.

2. The Task Force shall examine and review the operating procedures and practices currently in use in the County Jails, and, upon completion of this responsibility a Report shall be provided to the Governor and the Legislature in which the Task Force sets out:

- (a) Its recommendations for any needed improvements or changes which are believed to be necessary in order to upgrade and standardize the operating procedures and practices of Mississippi's County Jails; and
- (b) The Task Force's proposals to the Governor and the Legislature for new legislation and/or any changes in or revisions of rules, regulations and laws which it believes are needed to improve the operation of, and the conditions in the County Jails.

SECTION III:

The Task Force shall be supported by existing resources in the Department of Public Safety for all necessary expenditures over and above the mileage allowance provided for in Section II above. However, members of the State Senate serving on the Task Force shall be reimbursed for expenses incurred in attending a scheduled meeting of the Task Force out of existing funds available to the Senate at the same per diem rate allowed its members for their attendance at a Senate Committee meeting.

The Chairman may appoint a Vice Chairman and a Secretary from the Task Force members to assist in carrying out the functions of the Task Force. The Chairman shall, in consultation with the members of the Task Force, establish the agenda for the Task Force meetings and other activities.


The Chairman shall provide for the dissemination to appropriate parties of information on the activities of the Task Force in order to allow for the implementation of coordinated plans, standards, and proposals developed by the Task Force. The Chairman shall establish, in consultation with the members of the Task Force, such committees of the Task Force as are deemed necessary or appropriate for the efficient conduct of the Task Force's functions.

SECTION IV:


In formulating its recommendations, the Task Force shall obtain information from any source it deems appropriate, including public hearings. The Task Force shall meet monthly; however, should the Chairman deem it necessary, he may call for one special meeting each month during the Task Force's nine month period of existence.

The head of each department of Mississippi state government represented on the Task Force shall provide its representative with such administrative support as may be necessary to enable the agency representative to carry out his responsibilities to the activities of the Task Force.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 757

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning has officially indicated its intention to cease administering the Mississippi Guarantee Student Loan Program; and

WHEREAS, The Governor of the State of Mississippi is empowered to designate a private nonprofit organization to administer the program on behalf of the State of Mississippi as guarantor for the State; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has full power and authority to designate United Student Aid Funds, Inc., for the purpose of providing professional services and to engage in the transactions as contemplated by Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 (USC Section 1071 et seq.) for the guarantee of student loans for the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the Governor has determined that the services to be rendered by United Student Aid Funds, Inc., are both necessary and desirable and in the best interest of the State of Mississippi and that the United States Department of Education has approved this transfer:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me, do hereby designate, as of midnight, September 30, 1994, United Student Aid Funds, Inc., a not-for-profit Delaware Corporation, as guarantor for the State of Mississippi, to manage and operate the program in accordance with part B of Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965, (USC Section 1071 et seq.) for the guarantee of loans made by participating lenders to or on behalf of Mississippi residents and others who are admitted to and attending eligible institutions of higher education in the State of Mississippi. The State will cease to administer the Mississippi Guarantee Student Loan Program and United Student Aid Funds, Inc., will assume the guarantor function for the State of Mississippi; and

Further, with respect to existing loan guarantees, United Student Aid Funds, Inc., will serve as guarantor under the Higher Education Act of 1965 including all applicable federal rules and regulations. With respect to loans which will hereafter be guaranteed, United Student Aid Funds, Inc., will guarantee loans and serve as guarantor in accordance with the provisions of the Higher Education Act of 1965, including all applicable federal rules and regulations.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 756

WHEREAS, both the United States Supreme Court and the Mississippi Supreme Court have rendered decisions that require the State of Mississippi to follow policies and procedures that treat equally the retirement incomes of both federal retirees and state retirees for state income taxation purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Legislature has appropriated funds to satisfy the claims of a class of federal retirees whose claims fell within certain legal guidelines for the years 1985-1989; and


WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi should make an effort to determine what valid claims exist for other federal retirees who, because of legal technicalities, are not among the class of federal retirees presently eligible for refunds; and

WHEREAS, it is a proper function of the State Tax Commission to assess the validity of and the sum total of these otherwise excluded claims to determine the ability of the State of Mississippi to make a full and complete refund to this previously excluded class of retirees;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me, do hereby direct the Mississippi State Tax Commission to adopt a procedural method on or before September 1, 1994 to assess, tabulate, and make an accounting of those claims of that certain class of federal retirees that have otherwise been excluded from the class of those eligible to receive refunds for the year 1985-1989. The State Tax Commission is further ordered to collect such valid returns until December 15, 1994 and is ordered to employ whatever means it deems necessary to advise the members of the aforementioned class of retirees of this procedure. Further, the Commission is authorized to adopt whatever procedures it may deem necessary to make adequate assurance that those claims submitted are true and correct in all respects. Further, I hereby direct the State Tax Commission to make a report to the Governor, the Chairman of the Mississippi House of Representatives Appropriations Committee; and the Chairman of the Mississippi State Senate Appropriations Committee on or before February 1, 1995 of those amounts necessary to reimburse and to satisfy the aforementioned claims of these federal retirees.





WHEREAS, certain convicted felons now serving sentences imposed by the courts in Mississippi may be considered for parole after serving a portion of their sentences as established by law; and

WHEREAS, the Governor is required by law to transact the business of this State, and it is necessary to reconstitute the Mississippi State Parole Board in order to accomplish same:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me, do hereby reconstitute within the Executive Branch of Mississippi State Government the Mississippi State Parole Board which shall carry out and implement the statutory requirements to perform these duties. The Mississippi State Parole Board shall be composed of five (5) members who are presently serving in this capacity, having been appointed by the Governor. Each member shall devote full time to the duties of this office and shall keep such hours and work days as required of full-time state employees, under Section 25-1-98, of the Mississippi Code of 1972. Each member shall receive actual and necessary expenses, as authorized by Section 25-3-41, of the Mississippi Code of 1972.

The Mississippi State Parole Board shall have the authority and exclusive responsibility to:


- (1) Grant parole, as provided in Sections 47-7-3 and 47-7-17, of the Mississippi Code, and shall have exclusive authority for the revocation of parole, as provided in Section 47-7-27, of the Mississippi Code; and
- (2) Investigate clemency recommendations upon the request of the Governor; and
- (3) Receive and expend any federal or state funds appropriated for the purposes described herein, including but not limited to all funds appropriated by Senate Bill 3253; and
- (4) Promulgate rules, laws and regulations as necessary for the implementation of this Executive Order.

Further, the Mississippi State Parole Board shall have no authority or responsibility for supervision of offenders granted probation, parole or executive clemency, or other offenders requiring the same through interstate compact agreements; and

It shall be the duty of every department, board, commission, agency, office, institution and political subdivision of Mississippi State Government, and officers thereof, to render all possible assistance and cooperation to the Mississippi State Parole Board in order to reconstitute the Mississippi State Parole Board in the Executive Branch of Mississippi State Government, and in performing all other duties and responsibilities described therein.

Executive Order No. 753

Whereas, the health, economic and educational well-being and development of the people of Mississippi are of prime consideration to the State of Mississippi and to the Governor; and

Whereas, the State of Mississippi requires a comprehensive and coordinated approach in the administration of human services to the citizens of this state in order to strengthen communication and common purpose among all agencies and groups concerned with human services administration; in order to make full and effective use of existing resources and agency potentials; and, in order to avoid duplication, fragmentation, and waste; and

Whereas, the Governor is required by law to transact all the business of this state with the United States government and it is necessary to reconstitute the Department of Human Services in order to accomplish same:

Now, therefore, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me, do hereby reconstitute within the Executive Branch of Mississippi State Government a Department of Human Services. The chief administrative officer of the Department shall be the Executive Director, Gregg Phillips, who is presently serving in that capacity. The Executive Director shall establish the organizational structure of the Mississippi Department of Human Services which shall include the creation of any units necessary to implement the duties assigned to the Department and consistent with specific requirements of law. Further, the Executive Director shall appoint heads of offices, and any necessary supervisors, assistants and employees, who shall serve at the pleasure of the Executive Director. The salary and compensation of such employees shall be subject to the rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the State Personnel Board as created under Section 25-9-101 et seq. The Executive Director shall have the authority to organize offices as deemed appropriate to carry out the responsibilities of the Department.

The Department of Human Services shall have the authority and responsibility to:

- (1) Perform those duties prescribed by Sections 43-1-1 through 43-1-30 of the Mississippi Code of 1972 as Amended;
- (2) Formulate the policy of the department regarding human services within the jurisdiction of the department;
- (3) Adopt, modify, repeal and promulgate, after due notice and hearing, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal or state law, to make exceptions to and grant exemptions and variances from, and to enforce rules and regulations implementing or effectuating the powers and duties of the department under any and all statutes within the department's jurisdiction, all of which shall be binding upon the county departments of human services;
- (4) Apply for, receive and expend any federal or state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds from any other source, including but not limited to the receipt and expenditure of all funds appropriated by House Bill 1760;
- (5) Enter into and execute contracts, grants and cooperative agreements with any federal or state agency or subdivision thereof, or any public or private institution located inside or outside the State of Mississippi, or any person, corporation or association in connection with carrying out the programs of the department;

(6) Discharge such other duties, responsibilities and powers as are necessary to implement the programs of the department;

(7) Promulgate rules, laws, and regulations as necessary for the implementation of this Executive Order.



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 752

WHEREAS, during the month of February, 1994, freezing rain and sleet produced by a severe winter storm caused massive damage to the northern part of the State of Mississippi. The list of additional inmates who volunteered to participate in the cleanup work detail is attached to this Executive Order and made a part hereof.

WHEREAS, these inmates satisfactorily performed services for the citizens of Mississippi, and the State's policy is to encourage rehabilitation and a sense of public responsibility on the part of inmates, and to provide urgently needed assistance during emergency situations.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State, do hereby grant to the individuals named on the attached list, as reflected by the work schedule maintained by the Commissioner of the Mississippi Department of Corrections, fifteen days executive good time for each day worked, not to exceed one hundred eighty (180) days. Persons under sentence for life are prohibited from having time applied toward parole eligibility.


All executive good time granted by this Order will count toward parole and/or discharge.

This executive good time is granted at the request of the Department of Corrections and is based upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections.



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 751

WHEREAS, the illegal use of narcotics and drugs in the nation and in the State of Mississippi continues to rise at an alarming rate. The harmful effect of illegal drug use threatens the health, safety and welfare of all our citizens and has prompted the president of the United States to declare war on drugs. WHEREAS, in accordance with 32 U.S.C., Section 112, the Secretary of Defense and the National Guard Bureau in Washington, D.C., provide funding support to Mississippi National Guard units for drug interdiction, eradication assistance, and Drug Demand Reduction Activities to law enforcement agencies, upon approval of a state counterdrug plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this state, and in order to ensure appropriate funding from the Secretary of Defense and the National Guard Bureau, authorize the Mississippi National Guard to provide needed support to federal, state, county and local law enforcement agencies to assist in counterdrug activities. When a determination has been made by the Mississippi Military Department and the federal, state, county, or local law enforcement agency being supported that arming is necessary for self-defense purposes, members of the Mississippi Military Department and the federal, state, county or local law enforcement agency can be armed when taking part in counterdrug activities.



This executive good time is granted at the request of the Department of Corrections and is based upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections.







EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 746

GOVERNOR'S TASK FORCE ON DRINKING WATER AND WASTEWATER

WHEREAS, the public health and welfare of our citizens are dependent upon the provision of adequate and safe drinking water; and

WHEREAS, the protection of our environmental resources is greatly dependent upon the provision of adequate wastewater treatment systems; and

WHEREAS, the ability of this State to aggressively promote economic development is greatly dependent upon readily available and adequate water and wastewater systems; and

WHEREAS, the status of drinking water and wastewater systems in Mississippi will be addressed by a Task Force of interested and knowledgeable citizens and State officials:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby order the formation of the Governor's Task Force on Drinking Water and Wastewater, effective immediately:

SECTION I:

The Task Force shall be composed of the following members:

1. The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality, or his designee;
2. The State Health Officer, or his designee;
3. The President of the Mississippi Rural Water Association, or his designee;
4. The President of the Mississippi Water & Pollution Control Operators' Association, or his designee;
5. The Executive Director of the Mississippi Municipal Association, or his designee;
6. The Executive Director of the Mississippi Association of Supervisors, or his designee;
7. The President of the Mississippi Engineering Society, or his designee;
8. The State Director of the Mississippi office of the USDA/Farmers Home Administration, or his designee;
9. The Executive Director of the Department of Economic and Community Development, or his designee;
10. The Executive Director of the Mississippi Rural Development Council, or his designee;
11. A representative of the Mississippi office of the Community Resource Group, Inc.
12. A member of the Mississippi State Senate;
13. A member of the Mississippi House of Representatives; and
14. The Public Service Commissioners, or their designees.

The membership of the Task Force shall appoint a chairman and additional officers as necessary to carry out its duties.

The Chairman may, from time to time, invite other officials to participate in meetings of the Task Force.

SECTION II:

1. The members of the Task Force shall be appointed by the Governor and shall serve at the pleasure of the Governor. The members of this Task Force shall serve without compensation.

2. The Task Force shall, in December of each year, provide a report to the Governor and the Legislature regarding its recommendations.

3. The Task Force shall review the status of water supply, drinking water and wastewater in the State and shall make recommendations for improvements or changes in order to meet the needs of the citizens of Mississippi.

4. The Task Force shall propose to the Governor and the Legislature rules, regulations and laws needed to improve the provision of water supply, drinking water and wastewater to the citizens of Mississippi.

SECTION III:

The Task Force shall be staffed and supported by existing resources in the Mississippi Department of Health and will receive no additional State funding. The Chairman may appoint a Vice Chairman and a Secretary from the Task Force members to assist in carrying out the functions of the Task Force. The Chairman shall, in consultation with the members of the Task Force, establish the agenda for the Task Force meetings and other activities.


The Chairman shall provide for the dissemination to appropriate parties of information on the activities of the Task Force in order to allow for the implementation of coordinated plans, standards, policies, rules and programs developed by the Task Force. The Chairman shall establish, in consultation with the members of the Task Force, such committees of the Task Force as are deemed necessary or appropriate for the efficient conduct of the Task Force functions.

SECTION IV:


In formulating its recommendations, the Task Force shall obtain information from any source it deems appropriate, including public hearings. The Task Force shall meet as often as is necessary to thoroughly evaluate the status of water supply, drinking water and wastewater in Mississippi.

The head of each department of Mississippi state government represented on the Task Force shall provide its representative with such administrative support as may be necessary to enable the agency representative to carry out their responsibilities to the activities of the Task Force.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 744

WHEREAS, conditions existing and expected to exist in the State of Mississippi as a result of freezing rain, sleet and flooding are of such grave nature as to result in imminent danger of additional loss of life and property; and

WHEREAS, civil authorities are unable to cope with the matter with the personnel and equipment available to them:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-3-1, 33-7-301 and 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby direct Major General James Garner, Adjutant General of the Mississippi National Guard, to order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi National Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to assist the civil authorities in the areas affected by freezing rain, sleet and flooding, to restore and preserve order, and to protect lives and property. Major General Garner will be in direct command of the troops ordered to active duty and will use such equipment as may be found necessary in his opinion to accomplish the mission of the National Guard troops. The number of troops used and the amount of expense incurred will be held to a minimum compatible with the mission to be performed.

The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges and immunities of the statutes of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard and the State Militia where applicable.

The pay and expenses of the troops ordered out will be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-23, 33-7-313, 33-7-315 and 33-15-307, Mississippi Code of 1972.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 742

THE MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION FOR NATIONAL AND COMMUNITY SERVICE

WHEREAS, the increasing realization of the importance of volunteerism and civic participation, the growing recognition of community service as a means of community and state problem-solving, and the revival of national service as an avenue for addressing many of the country's unmet social, environmental, educational and public safety needs have revealed new options for enhancing the quality of life for Mississippians; and

WHEREAS, promoting the capability of Mississippi's people, communities and enterprises to work collaboratively is vital to the long-term prosperity of this State; and

WHEREAS, building and encouraging community service as an integral part of the formula to our growth as a State and as a nation requires cooperative efforts by the public sector, the private sector, the nonprofit sector, and partnerships among these sectors; and

WHEREAS, a State commission is necessary to advise and assist in the development of a comprehensive, statewide service plan for promoting volunteer involvement and citizen participation in Mississippi:

NOW, THEREFORE, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, **IT IS ORDERED**:

Section 1. Establishment.

The Mississippi Commission for National and Community Service (Commission) is hereby established to encourage community service and volunteer participation as a means of community and state problem-solving; to promote and support voluntary citizen involvement in government and private programs throughout the State; to develop a long-term, comprehensive vision and plan of action for community service initiatives in Mississippi; and to serve as the State's liaison to national and state organizations that support its mission.

Section 2. Membership.

A. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Governor on a bipartisan basis. It shall consist of no fewer than 15 and no more than 25 members. In establishing the Commission, the Governor shall appoint one-third of the initial members for a term of one year; one-third for a term of two years; and one-third for a term of three years. Following expiration of these initial terms, all appointments shall be for three-year renewable terms.

B. The Commission shall include:

- (1) An individual with expertise in the educational, training, and developmental needs of youth, particularly disadvantaged youth;
- (2) An individual with experience in promoting the involvement of older adults in service and volunteerism;

- (3) A representative of community-based agencies or community-based organizations within the State;
- (4) The head of the State educational agency, (or designated substitute);
- (5) A representative of local governments in the State;
- (6) A representative of local labor organizations in the State;
- (7) A representative of business;
- (8) An individual between the ages of 16 and 25 who is a participant or supervisor in a volunteer or service program;
- (9) A representative of a national service program; and
- (10) A representative of the Corporation for National and Community Service, described in Section 122(a) of the United States Public Law 103-82, as a non-voting, ex officio member.

C. The Commission may include:

- (1) Members selected from among local educators;
- (2) Members selected from among experts in the delivery of human, educational, environmental, or public safety services to communities and persons;
- (3) Representative of Native American tribes;
- (4) Members selected from among out-of-school youth or other at-risk youth; and
- (5) Representatives of entities that receive assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973 (42 U.S.C. 4950 et seq.).

D. Not more than 25 percent of the Commission members may be employees of State government, though additional State agency representatives may sit on the Commission as non-voting, ex officio members.

E. Vacancies among the members shall be filled by the Governor to serve for the remainder of the term.

Section 3. Officers.

The Officers of the Commission shall be Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. All officers shall be elected by the voting Commission members from among their ranks and shall serve for a term of one year. Vacancies in any offices shall be filled with an election by the Commission for the remainder of the unexpired term.

a. Chairman: It shall be the responsibility of the Chairman to preside at all meetings of the Commission; to appoint all committee chairmen; to assist all chairmen in the planning of committee activities; to supervise all chairmen as to the management of committee plans; to authorize and execute the wishes of the

Commission; to call all special meetings with the approval of the Governor; and to be an ex officio member of all committees.

b. Vice Chairman: The Vice Chairman shall assist the Chairman and, in the absence of the Chairman, perform those duties. The Vice Chairman shall accept special assignments from the Chairman and perform other duties as delegated by the Commission.

c. Secretary: The Secretary shall be responsible for the minutes of the meetings of the Commission and the Executive Committee; shall keep an updated list of names, addresses and telephone numbers of all Commission and Standing Committee members; and shall keep a record of attendance at meetings.

d. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall oversee the preparation of all funding applications. The Treasurer shall also report on finances to the Commission at each meeting.

Section 4. Standing Committees.

The Standing Committees shall advise and assist the Commission in carrying out its duties and responsibilities. Committee chairmen shall be appointed by the Commission Chairman from among Commission members, but the committees' members need not be limited to Commission members. The Commission Chairman, in consultation with the Committee Chairmen, shall name the committees' members. Standing Committees of the Commission shall include:

a. Youth Voice: The Standing Committee on Youth Voice shall have no more than fifteen (15) members between the ages of 15 and 25. Its responsibilities shall include developing and recommending policies and programs to the Commission as well as bringing the perspective of young people to all Commission discussions and decisions.

b. Volunteer Recognition: The Standing Committee on Volunteer Recognition shall assist with the implementation of the Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence awards relating to exemplary volunteer service in the State; work with individual communities to develop local recognition programs; and explore additional opportunities to recognize individuals and organizations addressing community needs through volunteer service.

c. Evaluation: The Standing Committee on Evaluation shall evaluate each program funded by the Corporation for National and Community Service and state organizations that support the purpose of the Commission to assure its ongoing quality.

d. Community Collaboration: The Standing Committee on Community Collaboration shall promote communication and information sharing between state and local, private and public initiatives to meet community needs.

e. Resource Development: The Standing Committee on Resource Development shall develop and implement strategies to secure local, state and federal resources to reinforce, expand and initiate quality community programs across the State.

Section 5. Meetings.

The Commission shall meet at least quarterly. Failure to attend at least seventy-five (75) percent of called meetings in any calendar year shall result in removal from the Commission. A quorum shall consist of a simple majority of voting members.

Section 6. Duties.

The Commission shall, in the performance of its tasks and functions:

- a. Ensure that its funding decisions meet all federal and State statutory requirements;
- b. Recommend innovative, creative, statewide service programs to increase volunteer participation in all age groups and community-based problem-solving among diverse participants;
- c. Develop and implement a centralized, organized system of obtaining information and technical support concerning volunteerism and community service recruitment, projects, training methods, materials and activities throughout Mississippi, and share such information and support upon request;
- d. Promote strong interagency collaboration as an avenue for maximizing resources and provide that model on the State level;
- e. Provide public recognition and support of individual volunteer efforts and successful or promising private sector initiatives and public/private partnerships that address community needs;
- f. Stimulate increased community awareness of the impact of volunteer services in Mississippi;
- g. Utilize local, State and federal resources to reinforce, expand and initiate quality service programs;
- h. Serve as the State's liaison and voice to appropriate national and State organizations that support its mission;
- i. Prepare a national three-year service plan for the State that follows State and federal guidelines;
- j. Prepare the financial assistance applications of the State under Sections 117B and 1301 of the Public Law 103-82;
- k. Assist in the preparation of the application of the Mississippi State Department of Education for assistance under Section 113 of the Public Law 103-82;
- l. Prepare the State's application under Section 130 for the approval of service positions such as the national service educational award described in Subtitle D of the Public Law 103-82;

m. Make technical assistance available to enable applicants for assistance under Section 121 to plan and implement service programs and to apply for assistance under the federal service laws, such as the Public Law 103-82;

n. Assist in the provision of health care and child care benefits under Section 140 to participants in national service programs that receive assistance under Section 121 of the Public Law 103-82;

o. Develop a State system for the recruitment and placement of participants in programs that receive assistance under the national service laws and disseminate information concerning national service programs that receive such assistance or approved national service positions;

p. Administer the State's grant program in support of national service programs (using assistance provided to the State under Section 121 of the Public Law 103-82) including selection, oversight and evaluation of grant recipients; and

q. Coordinate its functions (including recruitment, public awareness and training activities) with any division of the federal ACTION program or the Corporation for National and Community Services outlined in the Public Law 103-82.

Section 7. Administration and Expenses.

The Governor's Office and the Institutions of Higher Learning shall provide necessary administrative and staff support services to the Commission. The Commission is authorized to accept funds and in-kind services from other State and federal authorities, as authorized by law. No per diem allowance shall be paid to members of the Commission. Members of the Commission and staff shall receive necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with State law.

This Order is effective immediately and rescinds and replaces Executive Order #740.



WHEREAS, promoting the capability of Mississippi's people, communities and enterprises to work collaboratively is vital to the long-term prosperity of this State; and

WHEREAS, building and encouraging community service as an integral part of the formula to our growth as a State and as a nation requires cooperative efforts by the public sector, the private sector, the nonprofit sector, and partnerships among these sectors; and

WHEREAS, a State commission is necessary to advise and assist in the development of a comprehensive, statewide service plan for promoting volunteer involvement and citizen participation in Mississippi;

NOW, THEREFORE, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, **IT IS ORDERED**:

Section 1. Establishment.

The State Commission on National and Community Service (Commission) is hereby established to encourage community service and volunteer participation as a means of community and state problem-solving; to promote and support voluntary citizen involvement in government and private programs throughout the State; to develop a long-term, comprehensive vision and plan of action for community service initiatives in Mississippi; and to serve as the State's liaison to national and state organizations that support its mission.

Section 2. Membership.

A. Members of the Commission shall be appointed by the Governor on a bipartisan basis. It shall consist of no fewer than 15 and no more than 25 members. In establishing the Commission, the Governor shall appoint one-third of the initial members for a term of one year; one-third for a term of two years; and one-third for a term of three years. Following expiration of these initial terms, all appointments shall be for three-year terms. Members may not serve two consecutive terms.

B. The Commission shall include:

(1) An individual with expertise in the educational, training, and developmental needs of youth, particularly disadvantaged youth;

(2) An individual with experience in promoting the involvement of older adults in service and volunteerism;

- (3) A representative of community-based agencies or community-based organizations within the State;
- (4) The head of the State educational agency, (or designated substitute);
- (5) A representative of local governments in the State;
- (6) A representative of local labor organizations in the State;
- (7) A representative of business;
- (8) An individual between the ages of 16 and 25 who is a participant or supervisor in a volunteer or service program;
- (9) A representative of a national service program; and
- (10) A representative of the Corporation for National and Community Service, described in Section 122(a) of the United States Public Law 103-82, as a non-voting, ex officio member.

C. The Commission may include:

- (1) Members selected from among local educators;
- (2) Members selected from among experts in the delivery of human, educational, environmental, or public safety services to communities and persons;
- (3) Representative of Native American tribes;
- (4) Members selected from among out-of-school youth or other at-risk youth; and
- (5) Representatives of entities that receive assistance under the Domestic Volunteer Service Act of 1973 (42 U.S.C. 4950 et seq.).

D. Not more than 25 percent of the Commission members may be employees of State government, though additional State agency representatives may sit on the Commission as non-voting, ex officio members.

E. Vacancies among the members shall be filled by the Governor to serve for the remainder of the term.

Section 3. Officers.

The Officers of the Commission shall be Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary and Treasurer. All officers shall be elected by the voting Commission members from among their ranks and shall serve for a term of one year. Vacancies in any offices shall be filled with an election by the Commission for the remainder of the unexpired term.

a. Chairman: It shall be the responsibility of the Chairman to preside at all meetings of the Commission; to appoint all committee chairmen; to assist all chairmen in the planning of committee activities; to supervise all chairmen as to the management of committee plans; to authorize and execute the wishes of the

Board; to call all special meetings with the approval of the Governor; and to be an ex officio member of all committees.

b. Vice Chairman: The Vice Chairman shall assist the Chairman and, in the absence of the Chairman, perform those duties. The Vice Chairman shall accept special assignments from the Chairman and perform other duties as delegated by the Commission.

c. Secretary: The Secretary shall be responsible for the minutes of the meetings of the Commission and the Executive Committee; shall keep an updated list of names, addresses and telephone numbers of all Commission and Standing Committee members; and shall keep a record of attendance at meetings.

d. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall oversee the preparation of all funding applications. The Treasurer shall also report on finances to the Commission at each meeting.

Section 4. Standing Committees.

The Standing Committees shall advise and assist the Commission in carrying out its duties and responsibilities. Committee chairmen shall be appointed by the Commission Chairman from among Commission members, but the committees' members need not be limited to Commission members. The Commission Chairman, in consultation with the Committee Chairmen, shall name the committees' members. Standing Committees of the Commission shall include:

a. Youth Voice: The Standing Committee on Youth Voice shall have no more than fifteen (15) members between the ages of 15 and 25. Its responsibilities shall include developing and recommending policies and programs to the Commission as well as bringing the perspective of young people to all Commission discussions and decisions.

b. Volunteer Recognition: The Standing Committee on Volunteer Recognition shall assist with the implementation of the Governor's Initiative for Volunteer Excellence awards relating to exemplary volunteer service in the State; work with individual communities to develop local recognition programs; and explore additional opportunities to recognize individuals and organizations addressing community needs through volunteer service.

c. Evaluation: The Standing Committee on Evaluation shall evaluate each program funded by the Corporation for National and Community Service and state organizations that support the purpose of the Commission to assure its ongoing quality.

d. Community Collaboration: The Standing Committee on Community Collaboration shall promote communication and information sharing between state and local, private and public initiatives to meet community needs.

e. Resource Development: The Standing Committee on Resource Development shall develop and implement strategies to secure local, state and federal resources to reinforce, expand and initiate quality community programs across the State.

Section 5. Meetings.

The Commission shall meet at least quarterly. Failure to attend at least seventy-five (75) percent of called meetings in any calendar year shall result in removal from the Commission. A quorum shall consist of a simple majority of voting members.

Section 6. Duties.

The Commission shall, in the performance of its tasks and functions:

- a. Ensure that its funding decisions meet all federal and State statutory requirements;
- b. Recommend innovative, creative, statewide service programs to increase volunteer participation in all age groups and community-based problem-solving among diverse participants;
- c. Develop and implement a centralized, organized system of obtaining information and technical support concerning volunteerism and community service recruitment, projects, training methods, materials and activities throughout Mississippi, and share such information and support upon request;
- d. Promote strong interagency collaboration as an avenue for maximizing resources and provide that model on the State level;
- e. Provide public recognition and support of individual volunteer efforts and successful or promising private sector initiatives and public/private partnerships that address community needs;
- f. Stimulate increased community awareness of the impact of volunteer services in Mississippi;
- g. Utilize local, State and federal resources to reinforce, expand and initiate quality service programs;
- h. Serve as the State's liaison and voice to appropriate national and State organizations that support its mission;
- i. Prepare a national three-year service plan for the State that follows State and federal guidelines;
- j. Prepare the financial assistance applications of the State under Sections 117B and 1301 of the Public Law 103-82;
- k. Assist in the preparation of the application of the Mississippi State Department of Education for assistance under Section 113 of the Public Law 103-82;
- l. Prepare the State's application under Section 130 for the approval of service positions such as the national service educational award described in Subtitle D of the Public Law 103-82;

m. Make technical assistance available to enable applicants for assistance under Section 121 to plan and implement service programs and to apply for assistance under the federal service laws, such as the Public Law 103-82;

n. Assist in the provision of health care and child care benefits under Section 140 to participants in national service programs that receive assistance under Section 121 of the Public Law 103-82;

o. Develop a State system for the recruitment and placement of participants in programs that receive assistance under the national service laws and disseminate information concerning national service programs that receive such assistance or approved national service positions;

p. Administer the State's grant program in support of national service programs (using assistance provided to the State under Section 121 of the Public Law 103-82) including selection, oversight and evaluation of grant recipients; and

q. Coordinate its functions (including recruitment, public awareness and training activities) with any division of the federal ACTION program or the Corporation for National and Community Services outlined in the Public Law 103-82.

Section 7. Administration and Expenses.

The Governor's Office and The Department of Economic and Community Development shall provide necessary administrative and staff support services to the Commission. The Commission is authorized to accept funds and in-kind services from other State and federal authorities, as authorized by law. No per diem allowance shall be paid to members of the Commission. Members of the Commission and staff shall receive necessary travel and subsistence expenses in accordance with State law.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 739

WHEREAS, the right of citizens of the United States and the State of Mississippi to vote is a fundamental right; and

WHEREAS, the federal, state and local governments have a duty to promote the exercise of the right to vote; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress recently has passed legislation entitled the "National Voter Registration Act of 1993," to provide for the legislation of voters in elections for federal office; and

WHEREAS, the Act requires that each state comply with certain requirements with respect to administration of voter registration in elections for federal office; and

WHEREAS, the Act further requires each state to designate a state officer or employee as the chief state election official, who shall be responsible for coordination of state responsibilities under the Act:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, based upon these considerations, and for other good and valid reasons which relate thereto, do hereby name and appoint the Secretary of the State of Mississippi as the chief state election official, for the purposes of compliance with the National Voter Registration Act of 1993.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED, that there is hereby created a National Voter Registration Act Implementation Committee, that shall be charged with ensuring Mississippi's compliance with the Act, and with drafting any needed compliance legislation, if necessary. The committee also will be charged with educational promotion of the Act and its provisions. The Committee may utilize existing staff, equipment and resources, as it deems necessary. The Implementation Committee shall consist of a representative from each of the following:

- a. Mississippi Department of Public Safety, Division of Motor Vehicles, to be appointed by the Director of the Department;
- b. Mississippi Department of Human Services, to be appointed by the Director of the Department;
- c. Mississippi Department of Rehabilitation Services, to be appointed by the Executive Director;
- d. Governor's Office, to be appointed by the Governor;
- e. Mississippi Attorney General's Office, to be appointed by the Attorney General;
- f. Mississippi Secretary of State's Office, to be appointed by the Secretary of State;
- g. Mississippi Department of Health, to be appointed by the Executive Director;

- h. Mississippi House and Senate Elections Committees, to be appointed by the Chairman of each Committee;
- i. Election Commissioners Association of Mississippi, to be appointed by the President of the Association;
- j. Mississippi Circuit Clerk's Association, to be appointed by the President of the Association;
- k. Federal Armed Services Recruiting Office, to be appointed by the Director of the Federal Voting Assistance Program, Department of Defense;
- l. Mississippi Democratic Party, to be appointed by the Chairman of the Party;
- m. Mississippi Republican Party, to be appointed by the Chairman of the Party; and
- n. Three Members at Large, to be appointed by the Governor.




WHEREAS, the agreement will supplement and increase the level of services provided with nonfederal funds, but will in no event supplant services provided with nonfederal funds:


WHEREAS, the parents of Mississippi's children have a legal, moral and ethical responsibility for ensuring the well-being of their offspring by providing consistent and timely financial support regardless of their marital status; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Department of Human Services, Division of Child Support Enforcement, has been charged with the task of locating absent parents, establishing paternity, obtaining and enforcing court orders for child support, and collecting and distributing child support payments; and

WHEREAS, the need to provide the most efficient and productive method of enforcement of the laws regarding the support of Mississippi's children has not and cannot be met by the presently constructed system of service delivery, as has been exhibited by four years of noncompliance with federal child support regulations that has resulted in several million dollars in sanctions and \$292 million in outstanding child support payments owed to the children of Mississippi:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of the State of Mississippi, and in order to ensure that Mississippi's children are supported by their parents, do hereby order the Mississippi Department of Human Services to request competitive proposals from interested private parties to manage and operate all aspects of the Division of Child Support Enforcement, with the Department of Human Services maintaining only the oversight functions.

WHEREAS, the illegal use of narcotics and drugs in the nation and in the State of Mississippi continues to rise at an alarming rate. The harmful effect of illegal drug use threatens the health, safety and welfare of all our citizens and has prompted the President of the United States to declare war on drugs. Because of the continuing threat to the well-being of our citizens as a result of drug trafficking and related criminal activity, there is a particular and continuing need to use all available law enforcement agencies--including local, state and federal agencies--in a coordinated effort to provide our citizens with a drug-free environment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 32 U.S.C. Section 112, the Secretary of Defense and the National Guard Bureau in Washington, D.C., provide funding support to Mississippi National Guard units for drug interdiction and eradication assistance to law enforcement agencies, upon approval of a state counterdrug plan.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State, and in order to ensure appropriate funding from the Secretary of Defense and the National Guard Bureau, authorize the Mississippi National Guard to provide needed support to federal, state, county and local law enforcement agencies to assist in counterdrug activities. When a determination has been made by the Mississippi Military Department and the federal, state, county, or local law enforcement agency being supported that arming is necessary for self-defense purposes, members of the Mississippi Military Department and the federal, state, county or local law enforcement agency can be armed when taking part in counterdrug activities.

THIS Executive Order remains in effect henceforth, until rescinded by this Office.

GOVERNOR'S COMMISSION ON HEALTH CARE

It is well recognized that the United States has one of the most technologically advanced health care systems in the world. However, the exploding cost of health care is quickly eroding public confidence in our system. The cost of obtaining health care has become prohibitive for many citizens, and many are without health insurance or access to medical services. Nationally, health care expenditures constitute 14 percent of the gross national product. In Mississippi, more than 15 percent of State funds appropriated are budgeted for health-related services. Furthermore, although more than 500,000 Mississippians are covered by the Medicaid program, another 465,000 are estimated to be totally uninsured.

The health care system has become complex and sometimes inefficient. Federal regulations, patient demand and litigation promote more costly high-tech medical procedures at the expense of health promotion, education, and prevention. The result is over-utilization of emergency rooms and excessive inpatient hospitalization, two of the most expensive types of health care services. Because of the large number of uninsured persons in the State, the costs of providing this expensive care are shifted to those paying health insurance premiums, often the employers in the State.

While Mississippi shares these problems with all other states, our State is also unique. Twenty percent of our population is on Medicaid, with another twenty percent uninsured. In this situation, we are the most severely affected by federal mandates. This year the Mississippi Legislature was able to fund only 58% of the State's cost of the Medicaid program, yet federal health care reform may in the near future require the State also to pay for coverage of the additional twenty percent of the population that is uninsured.

Mississippi is also unique in the structure and resources of our health care system. We have only one teaching hospital and medical school, and the State has fewer primary care physicians for its population than any other state.

For these reasons, it is important for Mississippians to develop proposals for health care reform in Mississippi, keeping in mind our unique needs. Clearly, dollars well spent will provide better care for more citizens, and toward that end we must work diligently.

Therefore, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State hereby establish the "Governor's Commission on Health Care," whose duties, powers, and responsibilities shall be as follows:

1. The Commission shall consist of a Chairman and no more than 35 members appointed by the Governor. Membership shall include, but is not limited to, representatives from the public and private health care sectors and State policymakers responsible for or interested in health care.
2. The Commission shall meet as often as deemed necessary to meet the Commission's objectives.
3. The Commission shall serve as an official advisory group to the Governor on needs, policies, and legislation relating to health care.
4. The Commission shall have the full authority to review existing programs, data, research, and such other information as it deems necessary.
5. The Commission shall recommend to the Governor, no later than October 1, 1993, strategies for addressing the cost, financing, access, and delivery of health care in Mississippi.

This executive good time is granted at the request of the Department of Corrections and is based upon the recommendation of the Commissioner of the Department of Corrections.



EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 728

STATE INSPECTOR GENERAL

WHEREAS, the Constitution mandates that the Governor shall see that the laws of the State are faithfully executed; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution vests in the Executive Department the whole of the executive power which, in turn, is vested in the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the executive power includes the power to administer and enforce the laws as enacted by the legislature and as interpreted by the courts; and

WHEREAS, the Governor as chief executive is given the authority and it is his duty to act to enforce the laws, duly and constitutionally enacted, in every portion of the State, so that every citizen and all property will have the protection of the laws; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution vests in the Governor the general power to appoint persons to assist him in carrying out his duties; and

WHEREAS, the maintenance of public confidence in accountability, integrity and efficiency in the government of our State is a major concern of this administration; and

WHEREAS, this administration is determined to take all measures necessary to ensure that fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption in State Government are deterred, detected, prevented and eradicated; and

WHEREAS, the interests of the State would be best served by naming a State Inspector General who reports directly to the Governor with authority encompassing all of the executive branch of State Government:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, KIRK FORDICE, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby name in the Executive Department, Office of the Governor, the position State Inspector General, to examine, investigate, make recommendations and pursue charges with respect to the deterrence, detection, prevention and eradication of fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption in the executive branch of State Government, and otherwise assist the Governor in carrying out his duties as chief executive.

SECTION I: The State Inspector General

1. The State Inspector General shall be appointed by and serve at the pleasure of the Governor.
2. The State Inspector General shall exercise the authority as specified in this Order to fulfill the duties and

responsibilities as specified to establish such internal procedures and guidelines as may be necessary, including recommendations for specific corrective actions within the departments, agencies, boards, commissions, authorities, task forces, and divisions of the executive branch of State Government and all political subdivisions thereof (hereinafter referred to as "covered agencies").

SECTION II: The Office of the State Inspector General

1. The State Inspector General shall be assigned the necessary staff and resources to fulfill the duties and responsibilities as specified.

SECTION III: Authority of the State Inspector General

1. The State Inspector General is authorized to examine and investigate the management and affairs of the covered agencies concerning fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse and corruption.
2. In addition to the authority otherwise provided herein, the State Inspector General, in carrying out his duties and responsibilities, is authorized:
 - a. To make such investigations and reports relating to the administration of the programs and operations of covered agencies as are, in the judgment of the State Inspector General, necessary or desirable.
 - b. To request such information or assistance as may be necessary for carrying out the duties and responsibilities provided by this Executive Order from any Federal, State or local government agency or unit thereof.
 - c. To require and obtain immediately by written notice from officers and employees of covered agencies, to the fullest extent permitted to the Governor by the Mississippi Constitution or other law, all information, documents, reports, answers, records, accounts, papers and other necessary data and documentary evidence.
 - d. To have direct and prompt access to the heads of covered agencies when necessary for any purpose pertaining to the performance of functions and responsibilities under this Executive Order.
3. The State Inspector General is further authorized to perform any other functions necessary to fulfill the duties and responsibilities of the office.

SECTION IV: Duties and Responsibilities of the State Inspector General

1. The State Inspector General shall initiate, supervise, and coordinate investigative activities relating to fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption in covered agencies.
2. The State Inspector General shall receive complaints of fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption in covered agencies and determine whether they warrant investigation.
3. The State Inspector General shall investigate complaints of fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption when appropriate, determine whether disciplinary action, civil or criminal prosecution, or further investigation by relevant Federal, State or local agencies is warranted and take further action as appropriate.
4. The State Inspector General shall report complaints of fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption to such Federal, State or local agencies when there is evidence that non-state agency personnel have engaged in what may be criminal activity and when otherwise appropriate, and shall otherwise cooperate with them in any further action.
5. The State Inspector General shall recommend policies for and conduct, supervise and coordinate activities designed to deter, detect, prevent and eradicate fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption in covered agencies by periodically reviewing policies and procedures and monitoring day-to-day operations and making recommendations for improvement.
6. The State Inspector General shall report to the Governor.

SECTION V: Responsibilities of Covered Agencies

1. All officers and employees in covered agencies shall extend full cooperation and all reasonable assistance to the State Inspector General and his designees. No provision of this Order shall be construed to diminish the responsibility of said officers and employees to be vigilant in preventing and reporting fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption.
2. Complaints of fraud, waste, misconduct, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption shall be made to any agency inspector general, agency commissioner or director, any Deputy Inspector General or the State Inspector General as appropriate. Any agency inspector general and agency commissioner or director shall report all complaints of fraud, waste, inefficiencies, mismanagement, abuse or corruption to the State Inspector General.

SECTION VI: Complaints by employees; disclosure of identity; reprisals.


1. The State Inspector General may receive and investigate complaints or information from State employees concerning the possible existence of any activity in a covered agency constituting a violation of law, rules, regulations or mismanagement, fraud, waste of funds, abuse of authority, malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance, or a substantial and specific danger to the public health and safety.
2. No person shall take or threaten to take any action against any employee as a reprisal for making a complaint or disclosing information to the State Inspector General, unless the complaint was made or the information disclosed with the knowledge that it was false or with willful disregard for its truth or falsity.
3. The protections set forth in this Executive Order for employees who, in good faith, report fraud, waste, misconduct, malfeasance, misfeasance, nonfeasance, or abuse are in addition and supplementary to those protections provided by Section 25-9-171 through Section 25-9-177, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

SECTION VII: Covered Agencies


1. All departments, agencies, boards, commissions, authorities, task forces, and divisions of the executive branch of State Government and all political subdivisions thereof are covered by provisions of this Order.

Executive Order No. 725, promulgated December 18, 1992, is revoked and superseded by this Executive Order as of the date hereof. The provisions of this Executive Order are effective upon signature and shall remain in effect until amended, modified or rescinded by operation of law.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 727

MISSISSIPPI CIVIL WAR BATTLEFIELD COMMISSION

WHEREAS, the United States Department of the Interior has established the American Battlefield Protection Program aimed at protecting Civil War sites and structures; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi contains several nationally significant Civil War battle sites, including Vicksburg, Corinth, Champion Hill, Grand Gulf, and Brices Crossroads; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi also contains a rich Civil War history consisting of many other important Civil War sites and structures; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi and its citizens derive substantial benefit from the protection of Mississippi's Civil War structures and sites, including preserved public open space with its associated environmental benefits, historic preservation with its associated cultural and educational benefits, and economic development in the form of increased tourism and visitation to Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has enjoyed a cooperative and useful working relationship with the National Park Service in undertaking joint State/Federal planning projects associated with Civil War Battlefields and sites; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi can more effectively protect and enhance its Civil War sites by participating with the American Battlefield Protection Program; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress has created a national Civil War Sites Advisory Commission as part of the American Battlefield Protection Program; and

WHEREAS, the State, through a Civil War Battlefield Commission, can more readily access governmental and private foundation finances and technical support to preserve Mississippi's Civil War sites and structures:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of Mississippi, hereby proclaim the following effective immediately:

- A. There is hereby established the Mississippi Civil War Battlefield Commission.
- B. Membership
 - 1. The Governor shall appoint a Chairperson and Vice Chairperson to serve concurrently with the term of Office of the Governor.
 - 2. The Commission shall consist of fifteen (15) members as follows:

- a. Nine (9) members appointed by the Governor, with three (3) for a term concluding March 1, 1995, three (3) for a term concluding March 1, 1997, and three (3) for a term concluding March 1, 1999.
 - b. One (1) member appointed by the Lt. Governor for a term concluding March 1, 1999;
 - c. One (1) member appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives for a term concluding March 1, 1999;
 - d. One (1) member appointed by the Jackson Civil War Roundtable for a term concluding March 1, 1999; and
 - e. Three (3) members appointed by the Board of Trustees of the Department of Archives and History for terms concluding March 1, 1999.
3. Members shall serve six-year terms thereafter.
 4. In the event of a vacancy, the appointing authority shall appoint a successor.
 5. A majority of members of the Commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business. The Commission may adopt other procedures necessary to ensure the orderly transaction of business.
 6. The members of the Commission may not receive compensation for their services.
- C. Principal staff support for the Commission shall be provided by the Department of Archives and History. Other agencies shall assist when requested by the Commission.
- D. The Commission is hereby charged with the following tasks:
1. Identify and prioritize for protection Mississippi's Civil War sites and structures;
 2. Identify, analyze and enhance preservation opportunities for Mississippi's Civil War sites and structures;
 3. Review existing local, state and federal plans, programs and policies related to Mississippi's Civil War sites and structures;
 4. Develop relationships with federal and local officials and private conservation organizations which facilitate protection and enhancement of Civil War sites and structures;
 5. Coordinate Mississippi's participation with the federal government and private foundations to secure support and financial resources for the protection and enhancement of Civil War sites and structures;
 6. Advise State agencies on matters relating to Civil War sites and structures; and
 7. Perform other such duties or actions to advance Civil War history in Mississippi.

E. Procedures

1. The Commission shall meet at least quarterly.
2. The Commission may form subcommittees to address specific issues concerning preservation and enhancement of Civil War sites and structures.
3. By December 1st of each year, the Commission shall submit an annual report to the Governor, including recommendations for any legislative, administrative, or other changes the Commission deems necessary to further Civil War history in Mississippi.

- F. State agencies shall consider when undertaking permitting, planning, funding and construction actions, the impact of those actions on Civil War sites and structures as identified by the Commission.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 726

WHEREAS, the public policy of the State of Mississippi is to support science and technological innovations within the State's economy utilizing the resources of universities, businesses, State and local governments, and Federal laboratories; to promote the adaptation of technological innovations for commercial and public use; and to improve the economic, environmental and social well-being of all Mississippians; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi needs an organization to facilitate the coordination of science and technology policies and programs in support of business and economic development, to advise the Governor and Legislature on scientific and technological issues, to develop long-term plans for the enhancement of science and technology in Mississippi, and to assess and inventory existing scientific and technological research, technology transfer, and other State, Federal and industry resource capabilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State and in order to ensure that Mississippi's science and technology policies and programs are implemented for the general welfare of the citizens of Mississippi, do hereby order the creation of the **Mississippi Science and Technology Commission**. This organization will be purely advisory and will not be considered a unit of State Government.

The Mississippi Science and Technology Commission shall consist of seventeen (17) members as follows:

1. Four (4) representatives of private business to be appointed by the Governor;
2. Two (2) representatives of the Institutions of Higher Learning to be recommended by the Commissioner and approved by the Board of the Institutions of Higher Learning;

3. Three (3) representatives of the Mississippi Department of Economic and Community Development to be appointed by the Executive Director;
4. The Governor's advisor on economic development;
5. Chairman of the Mississippi Research Consortium or designee;
6. President of the Mississippi University Research Authority or designee;
7. President of the Institute for Technology Development;
8. Representative of the Community Colleges to be appointed by the Executive Director;
9. Representative of the resident agencies of the Federal laboratories to be recommended by representatives of such agencies and appointed by the Governor;
10. Representative of the Mississippi Senate to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; and
11. Representative of the Mississippi House to be appointed by the Speaker of the House.


Paragraph Five of Executive Order 713 is amended to designate the Mississippi Research Consortium and the Board of Trustees of the Institutions of Higher Learning as the Scientific and Technological Research Advisor to the Governor, replacing the designation of such institutions as the Science and Technology Advisor to the Governor.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 725

CREATING THE OFFICE OF STATE INSPECTOR GENERAL

WHEREAS, the prevention of wrongful acts and omissions in the agencies of state government and the protection of taxpayers' dollars is an important responsibility of the State; and

WHEREAS, the prevention of wrongful acts and omissions in state agencies depends in part on the development, implementation and enforcement of sound policies and procedures; and

WHEREAS, each state agency should exercise constant vigilance regarding the adequacy, implementation and enforcement of such policies and procedures; and

WHEREAS, the establishment of the Office of State Inspector General will facilitate the obligation to carry out the vigilance as described above.

NOW THEREFORE, I, KIRK FORDICE, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, including Article 5, Sections 120, 122, and 123 of the Mississippi Constitution and Section 7-1-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby establish in the Executive Department the Office of State Inspector General, to examine, investigate and make recommendations with respect to the prevention and detection of wrongful acts and omissions in the executive branch and agencies of state government, but specifically excluding the Legislature or any court of the State.

I. The State Inspector General:

1. The State Inspector General shall be appointed by the Governor.
2. The Governor shall appoint, as State Inspector General, only an individual who has demonstrated exemplary character and integrity, and who meets one or more of the following qualifications:
 - a. Experience as a law enforcement officer in this or any other state;
 - b. Admission to the Bar of this or any other state;
 - c. Service as the comptroller or similar officer of a public or private entity in this or any other state;
 - d. Certification as a certified public accountant in this or any other state.
 - e. Service in either the private or public sector in a position with duties substantially similar to those of the Inspector General.
3. No individual who has been convicted, in this or any other state, of a felony or of any crime

involving fraud, dishonesty, or moral turpitude shall be appointed State Inspector General.

4. In the performance of his duties the State Inspector General shall have the authority to administer oaths and issue and serve subpoenas upon any witness or for the production of documents, and such subpoenas may include a protective order requiring confidentiality of the subpoena, the subject matter, and any documents subpoenaed.

II. Duties and Responsibilities of the State Inspector General

1. The State Inspector General shall do all of the following:
 - a. Investigate the management and operation of state agencies on his own initiative in order to detect wrongful acts or omissions or improper use of taxpayer dollars that have been committed or are in the process of being committed by state agencies or employees;
 - b. Receive affidavits alleging wrongful acts and omissions, determine whether the affidavits allege facts that give reasonable cause to investigate, and if so, investigate to determine whether the alleged wrongful act or omission has in fact been committed or is in fact in the process of being committed by a state agency or employee;
 - c. Report wrongful acts or omissions that were or are being committed by state agencies or employees to the Governor and, as appropriate in the circumstances, to the appropriate prosecuting authority for possible criminal prosecution, the Ethics Commission, the appropriate licensing agency for possible disciplinary action, or the state employee's appointing authority for possible disciplinary action;
 - d. Report wrongful acts or omissions that were or are being committed by persons who are not state employees to the Governor and, as appropriate in the circumstances, to the appropriate prosecuting authority for possible criminal prosecution, the Ethics Commission, the appropriate licensing agency for possible disciplinary action, or the state employee's appointing authority for possible disciplinary action;
 - e. Identify other state agencies that also are responsible for investigating, auditing, reviewing or evaluating the management and operation of state agencies, and negotiate and enter into agreement with these agencies to share information and avoid duplication of effort;
 - f. Conduct studies of techniques of investigating and detecting, and of preventing or reducing the risk of, wrongful acts and omissions by state agencies and employees;
 - g. Consult with state agencies and advise them in developing, implementing and enforcing policies and procedures that will prevent or reduce risk of wrongful acts and omissions by their state officers or employees;

- h. After detecting a wrongful act or omission, review and evaluate the relevant policies and procedures of the state agency in which the wrongful act or omission occurred, and advise the state agency as to any changes that should be made in its policies and procedures so as to prevent recurrences of similar wrongful act of omissions.


III. Responsibilities of State Agencies

All departments, commissions, boards, agencies, and officers of the state, or any political subdivision thereof, are authorized and directed to cooperate with the State Inspector General in implementing the provisions of this Executive Order.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 716





EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 709

WHEREAS, illegal use of narcotics and drugs in the nation and in the State of Mississippi continues to rise at an alarming rate. The harmful effects of illegal drug use threatens the health, safety, and welfare of all of our citizens, and has prompted the President of the United States to declare a War on Drugs. Due to the continuing threat to the well-being of our citizens as a result of drug trafficking and related criminal activity, there is a particular and continuing need to use all available law enforcement agencies, including local, state, and federal, in a coordinated effort to provide our citizens with a drug-free environment; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 32 U.S.C. Section 112, the Secretary of Defense and the National Guard Bureau in Washington, D.C., provide funding support to the state National Guard Units to support drug interdiction and eradication assistance to law enforcement agencies, upon approval of a state counternarcotics plan. Approval of the Mississippi National Guard Counternarcotics Plan for fiscal year 1992 was recently granted by the Secretary of Defense and the Director of the National Guard Bureau. Counternarcotic activity funding for fiscal year 1992 received by the Mississippi National Guard was in excess of 2.5 million dollars, and a similar amount is expected for fiscal year 1993:


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State and in order to ensure appropriate funding from the Secretary of Defense and National Guard Bureau, authorize the Mississippi National Guard to provide needed support to federal, state, county, and local law enforcement agencies to assist in counternarcotic activities. EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 708

WHEREAS, conditions existing and expected to exist in Lauderdale County as a result of tornadoes, high winds and severe storms are of such grave nature as to result in imminent danger of additional loss of life and property; and

WHEREAS, civil authorities are unable to cope with the matter with the personnel and equipment available to them;


NOW, THEREFORE, I Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-3-1, 33-7-301 and 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby direct Major General James Garner, Adjutant General of the Mississippi National Guard, to order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi National Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to assist the civil authorities in the areas affected by tornadoes, high winds and severe storms, to restore and preserve order and to protect lives and property. Major General Garner will be in direct command of the troops ordered to active duty and will use such equipment as may be found necessary in his opinion to accomplish the mission of the National Guard troops. The number of troops used and the amount of expense incurred will be held to a minimum compatible with the mission to be performed.

The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges and immunities of the statutes of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard and the State Militia where applicable.

The pay and expenses of the troops ordered out will be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-23, 33-7-313 and 33-7-315, Mississippi Code of 1972.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 707

WHEREAS, Section 112 of the amended Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Education Act (PL 101-392-1990) requires each State which desires to participate in vocational education programs authorized by said Act for any fiscal year to establish a state council on vocational education to be appointed by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, it is incumbent upon the State of Mississippi to establish a State council on vocational education according to the revised P.L. 101-392-1990 so that the State can continue to participate in vocational education programs authorized by said Act, and for such Council to carry out the requirements prescribed by said Act; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me under the Constitution and applicable statutes of the State of Mississippi, and for the purpose of effectuating the State council on vocational education provisions of Section 112 of the revised Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Education Act (P.L. 101-392-1990), do hereby order as follows:

SECTION 1. There is hereby created and established the new Mississippi Council on Vocational Education, herein after called "State Council", to consist of thirteen (13) members appointed by the Governor.

SECTION 2. The new State Council shall be composed of the following membership:

A. Seven (7) representatives of the private sector in the State as follows:

(1) Five (5) representatives of business, industry, trade organizations, and agriculture, including one (1) member who is representative of small business concerns and one (1) member who is a private sector member of the State Job Training Coordinating Council (established pursuant to Section 122 of the Job Training Partnership Act); and

(2) Two (2) representatives of labor organizations.

B. Six (6) representatives of secondary and postsecondary vocational institutions (equitably distributed among such institutions), career guidance and counseling organizations within the State, individuals with special knowledge and qualifications with respect to the special educational and career development needs of special populations (including women, the disadvantaged, the handicapped, individuals with limited English proficiency, and minorities) of whom one is a representative of special education, and may include members of vocational student organizations and school board members.

SECTION 3. Of the members initially appointed to the new State Council, three (3) shall be appointed for the term ending December 31, 1994, four (4) shall be appointed for the term ending December 31, 1995, three (3) shall be appointed for the term ending December 31, 1996, and four (4) shall be appointed for the term ending December 31, 1997. Thereafter, the term of each member shall be for three (3) years. All vacancies among the members of the State Council shall be filled for the balance

of the unexpired term.

SECTION 4. The State Council shall select from among its membership a chairperson who shall be a representative of the private sector, and it shall adopt such rules for operating procedures as deemed necessary, except that such rules must provide for no less than one (1) public meeting each year at which the public is given an opportunity to express views concerning the Vocational Education, Job Training Partnership act, and any other employment related programs in the State whether they are federal or State funded. Proceedings from such public meetings shall be submitted to the Governor, the Legislature, and the appropriate agencies conducting the programs.

SECTION 5. The State Council shall have the following duties and responsibilities:

1. Meet with the State Board of Vocational Education and its representatives during the planning year to advise on the development of the Mississippi State plan for Vocational-Technical Education and all related strategic plans. In formulating the State Plan for vocational education, and amendments thereto, the State Board shall meet with and utilize the Council. State Board representatives shall provide the Council with planning information in a timely manner throughout the planning process and shall respond to Council recommendations in the Plan.

2. Make recommendations to the State Board of Education and make reports to the Governor, the Legislature, the business community and general public of the State, concerning:

- (A) The State Plan; and
- (B) Policies the State should pursue to strengthen vocational education (with particular attention to programs for the handicapped); and
- (C) Initiatives and methods the private sector could undertake to assist in the modernization of vocational education programs with particular attention to programs for the handicapped; and

3. Analyze and report on the distribution of spending for vocational education in the State and on the availability of vocational education activities and services within the State;

4. Furnish consultation to the State Board of Education on the establishment of evaluation criteria for vocational education programs within the State;

5. Submit recommendations to the State Board of Education on the conduct of vocational education programs conducted in the State which emphasize the use of business concerns and labor organizations;

6. Assess the distribution of financial assistance furnished under P.L. 101-392-1990, particularly with the analyses of the distribution of financial assistance between secondary vocational education programs and postsecondary vocational education programs;

7. Recommend procedures to the State Board of Vocational Education to ensure and enhance the participation of the public in the provision of vocational education at the local level within the State, particularly the participation of local employers and local labor organizations;

8. Report to the State Board of Education on the extent to which individuals who are members of special populations are provided with equal access to quality vocational education

programs;

9. Analyze and review corrections education programs; and

10. (A) Evaluate at least once every two (2) years:

- (i) the extent to which vocational education, employment and training programs in the State represent a consistent, integrated, and coordinated approach to meeting the economic needs of the State,
- (ii) the vocational education program delivery systems assisted under P.L. 101-392-1990 and under the Job Training Partnership Act in terms of such delivery systems' adequacy and effectiveness in achieving the purposes of each of the two (2) Acts; and
- (iii) make recommendations to the State Board of Vocational Education and the Governor on the adequacy and effectiveness of the coordination that takes place between vocational education and the Job Training Partnership Act; and

(B) Comment on the adequacy or inadequacy of State action in implementing the State Plan;

(C) Make recommendations to the State board on ways to create greater incentives for joint planning and collaboration between the vocational education system and the job training system at the State and local levels; and

(D) Advise the Governor, the State Board of Education, the State Job Training Coordinating Council, the Secretary of Education and the Secretary of Labor regarding such evaluation, findings, and recommendations.

SECTION 6. The State Council is authorized to obtain the services of such professional, technical and clerical personnel as may be necessary to enable it to carry out its functions under this Order and to contract for such services as may be necessary to enable it to carry out its functions under this Order and to contract for such services as may be necessary to enable it to carry out its evaluation functions, independent of programmatic and administrative control by other State boards, agencies and individuals as is required by the Carl D. Perkins Vocational and Applied Technology Act of 1990, and subsequent amendments.

SECTION 7. The expenditure of the federal funds paid pursuant to P.L. 101-392-1990 is to be determined solely by the State Council for carrying out its functions under this Order, and may not be diverted or reprogrammed for any other purpose by any State board, agency or individual. The State Council shall designate an appropriate State agency, or other public agency, eligible to receive funds under P.L. 101-392-1990 to act as its fiscal agent for purposes of disbursement, accounting, and auditing.

SECTION 8. The exercise by the Mississippi Council on Vocational education of the duties conferred by this Order shall be deemed held to be the performance of an essential governmental function of the State of Mississippi as related to the participation by the State in the vocational education programs authorized by the Carl D. Perkins Vocational Education Act (P.L. 101-392-1990).

SECTION 9. It shall be the duty of every department, agency, office, institution and political subdivision of the State of Mississippi, and the officers thereof, to cooperate with

and assist the Mississippi Council on Vocational Education as it carries out its responsibilities and duties under this Order.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 706

WHEREAS, infant mortality and morbidity represent a tremendous loss to the State of Mississippi and the causes of this problem are complex requiring a multidisciplinary approach that includes health planning, education, improved access to health care, and improved quality of care; and

WHEREAS, it is essential that Mississippi place a priority on decreasing the state's infant mortality and morbidity rates. To accomplish this, representatives of agencies and organizations, health professionals, and citizens with an interest in working toward this goal should be brought together to assist the Office of the Governor in developing strategies and initiatives to address this problem:

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kirk Fordice, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and applicable statutes of this State hereby establish the Governor's Advisory Council on Infant Mortality whose duties, powers and responsibilities shall be as follows:


1. The Advisory Council shall consist of a Chairperson and not more than 30 members appointed by the Governor. Membership shall include representatives of the public, private, and academic health care sectors, state policy makers, advocates and other interested citizens.
2. The Advisory Council shall meet quarterly unless otherwise directed by the Governor or the Chairperson.
3. The Advisory Council shall advise the Governor on needs, policies, and legislation relating to infant mortality and morbidity.
4. The Advisory Council shall seek information from individuals, organizations, and agencies involved in prenatal health care and education about infant mortality and morbidity.
5. The Advisory Council shall conduct studies about infant mortality and morbidity and methods of prevention.
6. The Advisory Council shall provide public awareness and advocacy on topics and issues relating to infant mortality and morbidity.
7. The Advisory Council shall be subject to the Open Meetings Law and Mississippi Public Records Law, and shall record all meetings, briefings, hearings and deliberations.

8. The authority for the existence of this Council shall cease as of January 1, 1996.


