WHEREAS, Section 125 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, as amended, states as follows:

The Governor shall have the power, and it is hereby made his duty, to suspend alleged defaulting state and county treasurers, and defaulting tax-collectors pending the investigation of their respective accounts, and to make temporary appointments of proper persons to fill the offices while such investigations are being made; and the legislature shall provide for the enforcement of this provision by appropriate legislation; and,

WHEREAS, Section 7-1-61, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, states as follows:

The Governor shall have the power, and it is his duty, to suspend alleged defaulting tax collectors pending the investigation of their respective accounts, whether made under the foregoing sections or otherwise, and to make temporary appointments of proper persons to fill the offices while such investigations are being made; and,

WHEREAS, it has been credibly alleged that the Tax Collector of Sunflower County, Ms Anna Addison Langston, hereinafter referred to as Ms. Anna Addison, has defaulted on her lawful duties and responsibilities as Tax Collector and Assessor of Sunflower County, on the basis that she is subject to an indictment by a Grand Jury of Sunflower County, Mississippi, filed on September 4, 2003, on three counts for the crime of embezzlement and related offenses under Sections 97-11-1, 97-11-29, 97-11-31 and 99-19-18, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, which indictment is hereby attached; and,

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Sunflower County has adopted a Resolution dated September 30, 2003 setting forth the nature and circumstances of the default by Ms. Anna Addison, requesting her suspension and the appointment of Ms. Carolyn Ray as Tax Collector and Assessor until such time as the criminal charges are resolved in favor of Ms. Addison, which resolution is hereby attached; and,

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 887

WHEREAS, Mississippi's rich heritage, is informed and influenced by the African-American experience, especially that of the culture of the Delta region, and

WHEREAS, life in the Delta was shaped by the land, the river and a people who found release and expression in a profound musical form that came to be known as the "blues"; and

WHEREAS, with migration north of African-Americans from the Delta, blues began to gain a wider audience for its original treatment of the elements of life, its joys and its sorrows; and

WHEREAS, the blues was the progenitor of much of American popular music in the post World War II era, including the enormously significant Rock n' Roll, and Rhythm and Blues, while influencing the evolution of jazz; and

WHEREAS, the United States Congress and the State of Mississippi have proclaimed 2003 the year of the blues, thereby celebrating in a formal way the cultural impact of this powerful, indigenous music; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi desires to recognize the large contribution of African-Americans to the cultural life of this State and Nation through blues and blues artists, many of whom share a Mississippi heritage, and to establish a point of focus for the promotion of this internationally acclaimed art form, the coordination with institutions and groups and individuals concerning the study of the blues, and the furtherance of education about this unique music tradition that continues to flourish;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, through Executive Order do hereby authorize and establish by virtue of the authority granted unto me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, the Mississippi Blues Commission, whose mission and structure shall be as follows:

I. MISSION

The mission of the Commission shall be to study, deliberate and report to the Governor and to the Mississippi Legislature by January 15, 2004 on the means determined best to foster an appreciation of the blues from diverse perspectives such as tourism, academic study, archival interest, historical preservation, cultural education and support of performing artists.

A. The report should include among its considerations the following:

- 1. An analysis of the tourism potential of the blues for Mississippi, and in particular for the Delta, and an inventory of blues "assets" that make up the blues landscape that could be developed into a program for tourism, domestic and international; opportunities for investment that would strengthen this potential should be identified.
- 2. The preparation of a plan for marketing the blues, including the tourism program, that features the historical, cultural, musical and business elements and opportunities of this "Bluesland". The marketing plan should be designed to attract tourists, conferences, music performances, filmmakers and others for the purpose of economic development of the blues, the region and the state.

II. STRUCTURE

The structure of the Commission, to consist of fifteen (15) members, shall be as follows:

- a. Two members of the Mississippi Senate
- b. Two members of the Mississippi House of Representatives
- c. The Director of the Tourism Division of the Mississippi Development Authority
- d. The Director of the Center for the Study of Southern Culture at the University of Mississippi
- e. The Director of the Center for Economic Development at Mississippi Valley State University
- f. The Director of the Delta Center for Culture and Learning at Delta State University
- g. The Director of the Mississippi Arts Commission
- h. Two members who shall have experience in cultural affairs or tourism development in the Mississippi Delta.
- i. Four members at large who shall have demonstrated a commitment to the understanding and promotion of the blues.

The Governor shall designate the Chair and Vice-chair of the Commission and a Secretary shall be selected, by a majority of the Commission, to discharge the administrative responsibilities of the Commission. The Division of Tourism of the Mississippi Development Authority shall provide administrative support.

II. COMPENSATION

Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for service or through the Commission and shall receive per diem and reimbursement for actual expenses only to the extent allowed by specific legislation.



Lipscomb, Adjutant General of the Mississippi National Guard, to order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to promote and secure the safety and protection of the citizens of Mississippi and their property. Major General Lipscomb will be in direct Command of the troops ordered to active duty and will use such equipment as may be found necessary in his opinion to accomplish the mission of the National Guard troops. The number of troops used and the amount of expense incurred shall be commensurate with the mission to be performed.

The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges, and immunities of the Statues of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard.

FURTHER, the pay and expenses of the troops ordered to State Active Duty shall be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-313, 33-7-313 and Section 33-9-15. All costs will be reimbursed as authorized by Section 33-15-307 4(g), the Mississippi Emergency Act of 1995, Mississippi Code of 1972.

State Interoperability Executive Committee

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi is committed to ensuring the public safety of the citizens, visitors, and natural resources of Mississippi; and,

WHEREAS, the Homeland Security Interoperable Communications Force and the State Radio Committee have already demonstrated the value of working across agency and jurisdictional lines to foster cooperation and coordination of voice and data information throughout the state; and,

WHEREAS, developing interoperable public safety communications systems is vital to the overall mission of public safety agencies and the safety of public safety personnel and the people they serve to protect; and,

WHEREAS, due to new technology and improved standards, the ability of public safety communications systems to be connected when and where necessary has been vastly improved in recent years; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to recognize, encourage, and continue a joint approach to wireless communications interoperability and system development among public safety entities within departments of state government;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby create and establish, the Mississippi State Interoperability Executive Committee.

I. PURPOSE

The Mississippi State Interoperability Executive Committee, hereafter referred to as SIEC, is hereby charged with fostering continued coordination across state agencies and between the state and other governmental agencies within Mississippi. The SIEC will also provide recommendations for both the immediate and longer-term improvement of public safety wireless communications interoperability and shared systems development.

II. MEMBERSHIP

The voting members of the SIEC shall be appointed as follows:

- 1. Commissioner, Department of Public Safety, or his designee.
- 2. Executive Director, Department of Transportation, or his designee
- 3. Executive Director, Mississippi Emergency Management Agency, or his designee
- 4. Executive Director, Department of Forestry, or his designee
- 5. Commissioner, Department of Corrections, or his designee
- 6. Adjutant General, Mississippi National Guard, or his designee
- 7. Executive Director, Department of Information Telecommunications Services, or his designee

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9. Director of Mississippi Highway Patrol

A quorum of the SIEC shall consist of a majority of the above appointed members. The members of the SIEC shall elect a voting member as chair. In addition, the SIEC should also include advisory members in its activities so as to broaden the perspectives of the SIEC across levels of government and functional disciplines. Advisory members may participate as members of any subcommittees established by the SIEC. Advisory members should include, at a minimum:

- 1. A Representative to be designated by the Speaker of the House
- 2. A Representative to be designated by the Lieutenant Governor
- 3. Chairman, Mississippi Association of Supervisors, or his designee
- 4. Chairman, Mississippi Municipal League, or his designee
- 5. A representative of the Mississippi Police Chiefs' Association
- 6. A representative of the Mississippi Sheriffs' Association
- 7. A representative of the Mississippi Fire Chiefs' Association
- 8. One or more representatives from Federal Law Enforcement (e.g., FBI)
- 9. A representative of the Governor's Office
- 10. Any other representatives deemed necessary by a majority vote of the SIEC.

III. <u>FUNCTIONS</u>

The Chair of the SIEC may designate the establishment of sub-committees to counsel the Committee on specific issues, including, but not limited to, technical interoperability solutions, funding strategies, shared system development strategies, local government issues, interoperability assessment requirements and findings.

The SIEC shall make a concerted effort to establish a statewide plan for assessing and instituting interoperability throughout the state. The plan should address both near and long-term interoperability solutions, realizing that both are necessary. In forming it's recommendations, the SIEC should, at a minimum:

- 1. Become thoroughly grounded in the fundamentals of interoperability and the technical solutions that currently exist so that they can serve as a central resource for unbiased information with in the state.
- 2. Involve as many agencies as possible that have recognized interoperability as a necessary capability within the public safety community
- 3. Examine needs and capabilities on a regional basis throughout the state (e.g., county by county)
- 4. Focus on leveraging or expanding the reach of existing resources and solutions wherever possible to reduce cost, time to implementation, and the total number of solutions needed
- 5. Identify appropriate locations to "pilot" solutions currently not in use somewhere else in the state as a way of proving their effectiveness
- 6. Consider the strategic procurement and placement of existing technical solutions (e.g., multiband switches or cross-system interconnects) as near-term interoperability fixes
- 7. Outline a method for prioritizing system connections both by region and statewide in order to start building a basic level of interoperability throughout the state (e.g., implement the connections that connect the most users first)

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- Provide initial estimates for new asset requirements to the governor and legislature based on the regional and statewide interoperability needs and proposed implementation schedules
- Continue with long-term planning for statewide communications and interoperability needs
- Ensure that any near-term interoperability solutions examined could be incorporated into longer-term statewide system development plans for infrastructure development
- 11. Investigate the need for additional state staff to manage and fully implement any shared system(s) and/or interoperability solutions, to include mutual aid frequency coordination and management.

The initial report of the SIEC and corresponding recommendations shall be made to the Governor and the House of Representatives and the Senate on or before January 31, 2004.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the SIEC shall receive no compensation for service on the committee but may receive reasonable reimbursement for actual expenses to the extent allowed by specific legislation and to the extent funds are available for that purpose.

WHEREAS, Homeland Security strategies require the coordinated effort of all state agencies, municipalities, counties, and other government, private and volunteer organizations who are committed to plan for and respond to Weapons of Mass Destruction incidents; and

WHEREAS, a need exists to expand the scope of the Terrorism Policy Group, created by the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency (MEMA) in 1999, and formalize such a group as the Homeland Security Council responsible for all State efforts that support the National Homeland Security Strategy;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby create and establish the Homeland Security Council for the State of Mississippi.

Section 1. Homeland Security Council (the "Council") shall be responsible for advising and assisting the Governor with respect to all aspects of homeland security. The Council shall serve as the mechanism for ensuring coordination of homeland security-related activities of executive departments and agencies and effective development and implementation of a State Strategy for homeland security.

Section 2. The Council shall have as its members: The Governor; The Executive Director of the Mississippi Emergency Management Agency; The Attorney General of Mississippi; The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Environmental Quality; The State Health Officer, Mississippi State Department of Health; The Commissioner of Insurance; The Commissioner of Public Safety; The Adjutant General, Mississippi Military Department; The Executive Director of Information Technology Services; The Executive Director of the Mississippi Department of Transportation; The Executive Director of Mississippi Commission for Volunteer Services; The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce; The State Veterinarian, Board of Animal Health; The Executive Director of Mississippi Developmental Authority; The heads of other Federal, State, and local departmental agencies and other senior officials shall be invited to attend council meetings when appropriate.

Section 3. The Council shall meet at the Governor's direction. When the Governor is absent from a meeting of the Council, the Director of Homeland Security may preside. The Office of Homeland Security shall be responsible, at the Director of Homeland Security's direction, for determining the agenda, ensuring that necessary papers are prepared, and recording Council actions and decisions.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 871

TO THE COMMISSIONER OF THE MISSISSIPPI DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS:

WHEREAS, RON CHRIS FOSTER, Mississippi Department of Corrections No.76130, was convicted on January 18, 1991 in Lauderdale County of capital murder and sentenced to death for the slaying of George Shelton, a convenience store clerk, during the commission of a robbery;

WHEREAS, after unsuccessful appeals by Foster of his sentence of death to the Mississippi Supreme Court and the United States Supreme Court, based on legal and factual issues relevant to controlling constitutional law, the Mississippi Supreme Court set the date of Wednesday, January 8, 2003 for the execution of Foster;

WHEREAS, a recent United States Supreme Court decision, <u>Atkins v. Virginia</u>, which has retroactive application, declared that the execution of persons who are mentally retarded is unconstitutional and the issue of whether Foster is mentally retarded has not been specifically addressed under the guidelines set forth in the <u>Atkins</u> decision;

WHEREAS, there is pending before the United States Supreme Court a petition to hear a case concerning the constitutionality of the application of the death penalty to juvenile offenders, those persons under the age of 18, and a decision by the highest court in the land whether to consider reviewing the specific issue of whether a 17 year-old offender such as Foster can be constitutionally sentenced to death will be made in a matter of weeks;

WHEREAS, although I am a strong proponent of the death penalty, it is not in the best interest of the State to execute a person when there may be decisions soon reached by the Mississippi Supreme Court and the United States Supreme Court that could determine whether such execution is in fact consistent with the Constitution of these United States;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of this State, do hereby issue a reprieve to RON CHRIS FOSTER from his scheduled execution on Wednesday, January 8, 2003, until such time in coming weeks as there is a determination by the Mississippi Supreme Court and the United States Supreme Court as to the application of the constitutional issues set forth above to the Foster matter. This stay of execution shall not otherwise affect the status of Foster.

I do hereby authorize and direct you to take notice and be governed accordingly.

The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges, and immunities of the Statue of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard.

FURTHER, the pay and expenses of the troops ordered to State Active Duty shall be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-313, 33-7-313 and 33-9-15. All costs will be reimbursed as authorized by Section 33-15-307 4(g), the Mississippi Emergency Act of 1995, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended.

ORAL HEALTH TASK FORCE

WHEREAS, good oral health and overall good general health are inseparable-the burden of dental and oral disease significantly diminishes the quality of life at school, work, and home;

WHEREAS, low-income, minority, and disabled populations have higher rates of oral health disease due to a lack of access to care, and lack of understanding of the importance of oral health to overall well-being;

WHEREAS, the Surgeon General reports that severe inequities in oral health occur among the financially disadvantaged, immigrants, seniors, the physically and developmentally challenged, and those in rural communities;

WHEREAS, 28% of Mississippi's children under age 5 live in poverty. Severe tooth decay is the most common chronic childhood disease in this group;

WHEREAS, less than fifty percent of Mississippi homes have access to fluoridated water, which is an important preventive public health measure, used to prevent tooth decay;

WHEREAS, upon review of the statistics and facts during the National Governors Association Oral Health Policy Academy hosted in Jackson, Mississippi, the members of the Mississippi Team agreed that the problem of oral health care needs for Mississippi's children has reached a critical level and warrants action;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, by the authority vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi do hereby create and establish the Oral Health Task Force.

MISSION L

Mississippi will be a state where every child enjoys optimal oral health; where prevention and health education are emphasized and treatment is available, accessible, affordable, and timely; and where the total well being of the child is promoted.

- 20. Four (4) Dentists licensed to practice dentistry in Mississippi;

The State Health Officer shall serve as chair of the task force, and the Department of Health, Bureau of Child Health, shall provide administrative support for the task force.

FUNCTIONS

The Oral Health Task Force will meet at least quarterly and provide annually a report to the Governor of the oral health status in Mississippi, including recommendations for action.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 857

Advisory Commission on Remote Sensing Technologies

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi recognizes the critical importance of accurate, accessible, up-to-date information about its people, transportation, property ownership, physical features, land, water and other resources; and

WHEREAS, newer technologies afford the State of Mississippi the opportunity to provide its citizens and governments with enhanced services in a more timely and cost-effective manner; and

WHEREAS, digital information about the state and its resources is a key component to Mississippi's economic development infrastructure and offers the State of Mississippi an expanded decision support system that can provide a competitive advantage with other states; and

WHEREAS, the majority of Mississippi maps produced by the United States Geological Survey are now more than twenty years old, of low accuracy and resolution, contain outdated and inaccurate data, not digitized and cannot be accessed through the Internet and do not utilize remote sensing technologies; and

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi needs high accuracy, high resolution mapping data which is timely and can be more easily updated, internet accessible, can be computermanipulated and utilizes remote sensing technologies in order to maintain its competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, a number of municipalities, counties, planning and development districts, universities, colleges, state and federal agencies are involved in remote sensing and geographic information system technologies; and

WHEREAS, a need to reduce duplication and coordinate efforts to maximize public spending and maintain the public's trust exists; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby create and establish the Governor's Advisory Commission on Remote Sensing Technologies.

I. <u>PURPOSE</u>

The Governor's Advisory Commission on Remote Sensing Technologies is hereby charged with developing recommendations for the formation of a uniform clearinghouse of public remote sensing data, including a digital land base computer model of the State of Mississippi, for the citizens of Mississippi and the world to use.

II. MEMBERSHIP

The Advisory Commission shall be appointed as follows:

- 1. Executive Director, Department of Environmental Quality, who shall serve as Chair
- 2. Executive Director, Department of Information Technology Services, who shall serve as Vice-Chair
- 3. Executive Director, Department of Transportation
- 4. Executive Director, Mississippi Development Authority
- 5. Executive Director, Mississippi Emergency Management Agency
- 6. Chair, Mississippi Institute for Forestry Inventory
- 7. Executive Director, Mississippi Automated Resource Information System
- 8. Executive Director, Mississippi Space Commerce Initiative
- 9. Executive Director, Remote Sensing Technologies Center
- 10. A representative of the Mississippi Association of Planning and Development Districts
- 11. Two (2) Representatives, to be designated by the Speaker of the House
- 12. Two (2) Senators, to be designated by the Lieutenant Governor
- 13. Chairman, Mississippi Association of Supervisors, or his designee
- 14. Chairman, Mississippi Municipal League, or his designee
- 15. A representative of the Governor's Office
- 16. Any other members designated by the Governor.

A quorum of the Commission shall consist of a majority of the members.

III. <u>FUNCTIONS</u>

The Chair of the Advisory Commission may designate the establishment of certain technical committees to counsel the commission remote sensing technologies and specific development areas, including transportation, natural resources, and utilities.

The initial recommendations shall be made on or before November 15, 2002. The Advisory Commission's recommendations shall include, but not be limited to:

- 1. Documenting and articulating of needs and benefits of remote sensing technologies to the State of Mississippi and her people;
- 2. Identifying key components of a remote sensing coordination program;
- 3. Identifying standardized data mapping layers;
- 4. Recommending uniform delivery systems and information technology infrastructure;
- Reviewing organizational issues and recommending any changes needed to assure the most cost-effective use of limited federal, state, and local funds and reduce duplicitous efforts;
- Promoting efficient and effective collaboration and coordination of data management and quality assurance issues; operation, maintenance and update issues;
- 7. Estimating costs for development, operation, and maintenance of a state-level coordinated the program for use by the public.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the commission shall receive no compensation for service on the commission and shall receive no per diem or reimbursement for actual expenses.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 855

WHEREAS, beginning on March 15, 2002 and continuing, the State of Mississippi has been besieged by an outbreak of severe weather, including tornadoes, damaging winds, torrential rainfall and flooding, and state assistance will be necessary to support local government response and recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, civil authorities will require support from the Mississippi National Guard to cope with said emergency:

NOW, THEREFORE, I Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-7-301, and 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby direct Major General James H. The council may also seek the participation of other State departments, agencies, boards and commissions, public interest groups and private organizations as determined necessary or appropriate.

II. FUNCTIONS

The mission and objective of the Council will include, but not be limited to, the following:

- 1. Development of a coordinating policy for increasing awareness of the needs ands assets of the Delta counties within Mississippi;
- 2. Review and recommendation of proposed Mississippi Delta projects to be submitted for funding by the Delta Regional Authority;
- Coordination and submission of a state development plan for the Mississippi Delta counties, as required by the Delta Regional Authority;
- 4. Identification of potential federal, state and local assistance available within the Mississippi Delta counties

III. MEETINGS

The Mississippi Advisory Council for the Delta Regional Authority shall meet as necessary to fulfill the objectives of this Executive Order. The Council may establish committees and sub-committees as necessary to assist in performing its duties and carrying out its responsibilities.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the Council shall receive no compensation but may be eligible for reimbursement for actual expenses to the extent allowed by Mississippi law and to the extent that funds are available for that purpose.

V. EFFECTIVE DATE

This order is effective immediately, and shall remain in effect until rescinded by the Governor.

The Governor's Commission for Citizens with Disabilities shall be a time limited commission with the sole purpose of assessing, evaluating and recommending action regarding the needs of citizens with disabilities.

II. MEMBERSHIP

The Commission shall consist of the following fourteen members, or their designees, who shall be appointed by and serve at the will and pleasure of the Governor:

- a. Executive Director of the Division of Medicaid;
- b. Executive Director of the Department of Rehabilitation Services;
- c. Executive Director of the Department of Mental Health;
- d. State Health Officer;
- e. At least one (1) representative from the Governor's office;
- f. Project Director of Living Independence For Everyone;
- g. Executive Director of The Arc of Mississippi;
- h. 7 individuals with disabilities, parents of or immediate family member with; and
- Other members not yet included but determined to be necessary by the Governor.

The Project Director of the Living Independence For Everyone shall serve as Chair of the Commission and shall provide administrative support. Thereafter, the Chair position shall rotate annually as well as the administrative support thereof, by vote of the members. All Commission members shall be voting members, each having one vote.

III. FUNCTIONS

The Commission is hereby charged with assessing for the Governor, proposed recommendations for assuring the quality of life for all Mississippi citizens faced with physical, mental, and/or developmental disabilities.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the Advisory Commission shall receive no compensation for service on the commission but may receive reasonable reimbursement for actual expenses to the extent allowed by specific legislation and to the extent funds are available for that purpose.

- 1. Two (2) Senators as designated by the Lieutenant Governor;
- m. Two (2) Representatives as designated by the Speaker of the House;
- n. Executive Director of the Mississippi Municipal Association;
- o. Executive Director of the Mississippi Supervisors Associations;
- p. Executive Director of the Mississippi Rural Water Association;
- executive Director of the Mississippi Water and Pollution Control Operators Association;
- r. Executive Director of the Mississippi USDA Rural Development Authority;
- s. Chief Engineer of the U.S. Corps of Engineers-Vicksburg District;
- t. U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service;
- u. Three (3) representatives, at-large;
- v. At least one (1) representative from the Governor's Office; and,
- w. Other members not yet included but determined to be necessary by the Governor.

The Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality shall serve as chair of the task force, and the Department of Environmental Quality shall provide administrative support for the task force.

III. FUNCTIONS

The Commission is hereby charged with developing for the Governor proposed recommendations for assuring the quality and safety of Mississippi's water resources. The initial recommendations to the Governor shall be made on or before October 15, 2001.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for service on the Commission and shall receive per diem and reimbursement for actual expenses only to the extent allowed by specific legislation.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 842

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi recognizes the critical importance of information technology to its government, industry and local economy; and

WHEREAS, technology has made enormous contributions to the state's economic growth and competitiveness; and

WHEREAS, the technology industry is one of the most important sectors of Mississippi's economy, with over 792 technology companies employing 7,000 Mississippi residents and generating over \$340 Million in annual wages; and

WHEREAS, software piracy represents one of the greatest threats to the continued growth of Mississippi's technology industry, with software piracy costing the Mississippi economy almost 1,000 jobs and \$22.5 Million in wages annually, and \$12 Million in lost corporate and sales tax revenues annually; and

WHEREAS, counterfeit and other forms of pirated software expose state agencies to the risk of computer viruses, reduced technical support, and other problems that prevent the efficient operation of information systems; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the State of Mississippi that we develop a comprehensive statewide response to combat the use of unlicensed software in all state agencies and to promote sound management of state information systems;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby order the following:

Section 1. Each state agency shall act reasonably to prevent and combat computer software piracy.

- (a) Each agency shall act to ensure that the agency does not knowingly acquire, reproduce, distribute, install, utilize or transmit computer software in violation of U. S. copyright and applicable licensing restrictions.
- (b) Each agency shall act to ensure that the agency has present on its computers and uses only computer software which it has a legal right to use. Each agency's actions shall include:
 - a) preparing agency inventories of the software present on its computers;
 - b) determining what computer software the agency has the authorization to use; and
 - c) developing and maintaining adequate record-keeping;
- (c) Each agency shall require its contractors and recipients of State financial assistance, including grants and loan guarantee assistance, to certify that they have appropriate systems and controls in place to ensure that State funds are not used to acquire, operate or maintain computer software in violation of U.S. copyright laws or mutually agreed to and executed license agreements. If any agency becomes aware that contractors, grantees or other recipients of State financial assistance are using State funds to acquire, operate or maintain computer software in violation of U.S. copyright laws or applicable licensing restrictions, the agency shall take such corrective measures as the agency head deems appropriate and consistent with the requirements of law.
- (d) The Mississippi Department of Information Technology Services (ITS) shall develop appropriate language for inclusion in State contracts to prohibit the use of State funds for the acquisition, operation or maintenance of computer software in violation of U.S. copyright laws or mutually agreed to and executed license agreements. Such language shall be required in all state contracts involving the purchase or utilization of computer software in the performance of such contracts.
- (e) State agencies shall cooperate fully in implementing this order and shall share information as appropriate that may be useful in combating computer software piracy.

Section 2. Responsibilities of Agency Heads. In connection with the acquisition and use of computer software, the head of each State agency shall ensure that the acceptable use policies and practices of the agency related to copyrights protecting computer software are adequate and fully implement the policies set forth in this Order.

Section 3. ITS shall develop and disseminate guidelines for agencies to follow as they develop acceptable use policies and procedures to effectively manage the inventory of software and associated licensing agreements.

Section 4. Judicial Review. This Order is intended only to improve the internal management of the agencies and is not intended to, and does not, create any right or benefit, substantive or procedural, enforceable at law or equity by a party against the State of Mississippi, its agencies or instrumentalities, its officers or employees, or any other person.

Section 5. Severability. The invalidity of any portion of this Order shall not affect the validity of the remainder thereof.

Section 6. Effective Date. This order is effective immediately.

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has been and will continue to be adversely affected by extremely dangerous wildfire conditions beginning September 5, 2000, and as a result thereof, explosive and severe wildfire conditions are causing forest fires to occur over wide areas of Mississippi, extensively damaging public and private property, including homes, other structures, and forestland, and creating life-threatening conditions to the public; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Forestry Commission has requested the imposition of a statewide open burning ban to cope with said disaster.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-7-301, et. seq., and in conjunction with Section 49-19-351, Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended, do hereby declare a statewide ban of all outdoor open burning. The State Forester as the representative of the Mississippi Forestry Commission has the authority to lift the burning ban as weather and fire danger conditions permit, and the State Forester as the representative of the Missission has the authority to lift the burning ban in local areas as local weather and fire danger conditions permit.

This order does not preempt the provisions of MCA § 49-19-351 or the penalties established therein.

IN ADDITION, all other state and local entities of government are directed to cooperate with the State Forestry Commission and the Mississippi Emergency Management Commission to accomplish the purposes of this Executive Order.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby create and establish the Governor's Commission on Electronic Government ("E-Government Commission") and order the following:

I. PURPOSE

The Governor's Commission on Electronic Government shall be a time-limited commission with the sole purpose of accomplishing the goal of examining the important issues related to electronic government so that many of the components of an electronic government infrastructure can be built in such a way as to save money and improve the effectiveness of state government.

II. MEMBERSHIP

The Commission shall consist of the following members, or their designees, who shall be appointed by and serve at the will and pleasure of the Governor:

- a. Executive Director of the Department of Finance and Administration;
- b. Executive Director of the Department of Information Technology Services;
- c. Secretary of State;
- d. State Treasurer;
- e. State Auditor;
- f. Attorney General;
- g. ' Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce;
- h. Executive Director of the Department of Economic and Community Development;
- Banking and Commerce Commissioner;
- j. Commissioner of the State Tax Commission;
- k. Public Safety Commissioner;
- 1. Executive Director of the Department of Human Services;
- m. State Superintendent of Education;
- n. Commissioner of Insurance;
- Commissioner of Higher Education;
- p. Executive Director of the Department of Wildlife, Fisheries, and Parks;
- q. Executive Director of the Department of Environmental Quality;
- r. Executive Director of the Department of Marine Resources;

s. Executive Director of the Board for Community and Junior Colleges;

t. State Health Officer;

u. Adjutant General of the Mississippi National Guard;

v. An independent information technology industry advisor;

w. Three (3) representatives of local government;

- Three (3) representatives of businesses that are regulated by a state agency or local government;
- y. Three (3) members selected at-large;
- z. At least one (1) representative from the Governor's Office; and,
- aa. Other members not yet included but determined to be necessary by the Governor.

The Executive Directors of the Department of Finance and Administration and the Department of Information Technology Resources shall serve as co-chairs of the Commission.

The Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, and Chief Justice of the Mississippi Supreme Court, or their designees, shall serve as non-voting, ex-officio members.

The Departments of Finance and Administration and Information Technology Services shall provide administrative support for the Commission.

The E-Government task force previously organized through the Department of Information Technology Services shall work closely with and provide information to the electronic government initiative and shall report to the Commission at its request.

III. FUNCTIONS

The Commission is hereby charged with developing for the Governor proposed recommendations for assuring the quality and timely evolvement of electronic government.

The initial recommendations to the Governor shall be made on or before December 1, 2000.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the Commission shall receive no compensation for service on the Commission and shall receive per diem and reimbursement for actual expenses only to the extent allowed by specific legislation.

WHEREAS, the Emergency Management Assistance Compact, Miss. Code Ann. Section 45-18-3, Article 9, to which both Mississippi and Florida belong, requires that a requesting party reimburse the state rendering assistance;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Section 7-1-5, 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby order and direct the following:

- (a) that Major General George Walker, order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi National Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to assist the civil authorities in the State of Florida;
- (b) that Major General Walker shall be in direct command of the troops ordered to active duty and he shall have authority to use such equipment as he determines is necessary to accomplish the support mission of the National Guard troops;
- (c) that the number of troops used and the amount of expense incurred shall be held to the minimum needed to perform the assigned mission;
- (d) that the members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges, and immunities of the statutes of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard;
- (e) that the pay and expenses of the troops ordered to State Active Duty shall be paid as provided in Sections 33-7-313, 33-7-315 and 33-9-15; and that all cost will be reimbursed as authorized by Section 33-15-307(4)(g), the Mississippi Emergency Act of 1995, Mississippi Code of 1972, which provides, in part, that the Disaster Assistance Trust Fund may be used for "support to another state under the provisions of the Emergency Management Assistance Compact";
- (f) that the State of Florida shall reimburse the State of Mississippi pursuant to the terms of the Emergency Management Assistance Compact.

WHEREAS, the Governor is the Commander-in-Chief of the Mississippi National Guard; and

WHEREAS, the safety and security of the State of Mississippi is of the utmost importance to the people of the State of Mississippi and to the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the capable management and military leadership of the Mississippi National Guard is of the utmost importance to the people of the State of Mississippi and to the Governor;

NOW THEREFORE I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, Commander-in-Chief of the Mississippi National Guard and the Militia, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Article 5, Section 119 and Article 9, Section 217 of the Mississippi Constitution of 1890 and Sections 7-1-5, 33-3-1 and 33-3-9 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby appoint George S. Walker as the senior full-time Assistant Adjutant General for the Mississippi National Guard and the Militia.

Further, I hereby appoint George S. Walker to the rank of Major General and designate Major General George S. Walker as Special Advisor to the Governor for Military Affairs. Major General George S. Walker shall be the senior officer in the Mississippi National Guard and executive head of the Mississippi Military Department, subordinate only to me in the administration of his official duties.

Further, the appropriate members of the Mississippi National Guard and the Mississippi Military Department are hereby ordered to take such expeditious action as necessary to effect the obtainment of federal recognition for George S. Walker in the rank of Major General.

Further, Major General George S. Walker shall be paid by the State of Mississippi a salary of \$80,000 (EIGHTY THOUSAND DOLLARS) per annum, in addition to such compensation, expense reimbursement, travel pay and other remuneration, as are typical and appropriate for the senior ranking officer of the Mississippi National Guard.

Further, as the senior full-time Assistant Adjutant General for the Mississippi National Guard and Mississippi Military Department, Major General George S. Walker is authorized and empowered by this Order and applicable law, including, but not limited to Section 33-3-9 of the Mississippi Code of 1972, to exercise and perform such duties on behalf of the Mississippi National Guard, Mississippi Military Department and the State of Mississippi as conferred by law and regulation. Such power shall include, but is in no manner limited to, the exercise of authority as detailed in Section 33-3-11 of the Mississippi Code of 1972; and under Title 32, Section 709, United States Code, to administer the Federal Technician Program, to approve and sign contracts, and to hire, relieve, transfer or dismiss members and employees of the Mississippi National Guard and Mississippi Military Department, to address grievances, personnel matters, collective bargaining agreements, and all matters of any nature whatsoever affecting or relating to, the Mississippi National Guard, the Mississippi Military Department, the Militia and their respective organizations, units, personnel, property and equipment. The provisions of this Executive Order are effective from and after May 9, 2000, and shall remain in effect until rescinded by the Governor.

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi has ruled that Chapter 31, Laws of 1894, which adopted the state flag and state coat-of-arms, was not brought forward in the Code of 1906; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi has ruled that there is no existing law establishing or promulgating a flag or coat-of-arms for the State of Mississippi; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of the State of Mississippi has determined the flag and coatof-arms currently in use are such by usage and custom only; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Supreme Court has determined that the decision to adopt or not adopt a flag for Mississippi is wholly within the power of the Mississippi Legislature and the executive branch of government; and

WHEREAS, the determination of the flag and coat-of-arms of the State of Mississippi are essential for the continuation without interruption of public and private business;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby create and establish the Advisory Commission on the Mississippi State Flag and the Mississippi Coat-of-Arms.

I. <u>PURPOSE</u>

The Advisory Commission on the Mississippi State Flag and the Mississippi Coat-of-Arms shall be a time-limited commission with the sole purpose of proposing and reporting a design for the State Flag and for the State Coat-of-Arms to the Governor, Lt. Governor, and the Speaker of the House on or before May 4, 2001.

II. MEMBERSHIP

The Advisory Commission shall be appointed as follows:

- a. three (3) members of the Mississippi House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House;
- b. three (3) members of the Mississippi Senate appointed by the Lt. Governor;
- c. eleven members appointed by the Governor, to include:

- (1) two (2) representatives from the field of education
- (2) a representative from the Mississippi Economic Council
- (3) a representative from the Mississippi Arts Commission
- (4) a representative from the Archives and History Board
- (5) three (3) representatives from business and industry, and
- (6) three (3) members at-large.

All appointments to the Commission shall be made by July 1, 2000.

The chairman of the Commission shall be appointed by the Governor from the members of the Commission.

A quorum of the Commission shall consist of a majority of the members.

III. FUNCTIONS

The Advisory Commission on the Mississippi State Flag and the Mississippi Coat-of-Arms shall have the following functions and duties:

- a. to hold regular, public meetings when and where it sees fit;
- b. to receive written, public comment, in a manner it sees fit, and to hold public hearings, under the terms and conditions it determines and sees fit;
- to collect, examine and consider all information which it determines may be helpful in making a recommendation on use and adoption of Mississippi's state flag and coat of arms;
- to consult with historical experts, social science experts, representatives of organizations and associations, and others, as it sees fit, whose knowledge or expertise may assist the Commission in making its recommendation;
- to make any inquiries and conduct any business that may assist the Advisory Commission in submitting a design for a state flag and a state coat of arms, which may include the current designs;
- f. keep minutes of its meetings, and make those minutes available to the public;
- g. to make a written recommendation, and oral presentation if requested, to the Governor, the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House on or before May 4, 2001.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the Advisory Commission shall receive no compensation for service on the commission but may receive reasonable reimbursement for actual expenses to the extent allowed by specific legislation and to the extent funds are available for that purpose.

Furthermore, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi do hereby order the state flag and coat-of-arms currently in use remain in use until such time as the Mississippi Legislature considers the report of the commission and the Legislature has had ample time to act.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 832

WHEREAS, William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, was sentenced on November 4, 1999, in Copiah County, Mississippi, to serve ten (10) years in the Mississippi State Penitentiary, on the charge of Unlawful Possession of More Than 10 Grams of Methamphetamine; and

WHEREAS, William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, was on January 5, 2000, granted a conditional Governor's Suspension of Sentence; and

WHEREAS, having reasonable cause to believe that William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, a prisoner of the State of Mississippi, conditionally released from the Mississippi Department of Corrections, has violated the terms and special conditions of his release under Executive Order No. 820 by his failure to abide by curfew, his failure to live at his stated residence, his failure to obey the law by committing a disturbance of the peace, his failure to abide by the special conditions of his release, and for other reasons deemed sufficient by the Governor; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Corrections requested that William Sherman be returned to custody;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Law of this State, do hereby order the said William Sherman, MDOC No. 12089, to be retaken and returned to the said Mississippi State Penitentiary and into the actual custody of the Warden or Superintendent, and I hereby authorize and require you to so retake him and for so doing, this shall be your sufficient warrant.

FURTHER, this Executive Order shall supercede Executive Order Number 820.

I authorize and direct you, upon receipt of this Executive Order, to be notice and be governed accordingly.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 831

WHEREAS, Mississippi has laid a strong foundation for education through the Mississippi Adequate Education Program which will reach its full implementation by the year 2002; and

WHEREAS, Mississippi must continue to take sound and innovative measure to strengthen its schools; and

WHEREAS, technology and the world wide web offer exceptional educational resources for Mississippi's school children and teachers; and

WHEREAS, the public and private sectors, working together, have the capability to make technology and world wide web resources available to Mississippi's school children and teachers by placing an Internet-accessible computer in every classroom in every school in every district in every county of the State of Mississippi;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, by the authority vested in me by the Constitution and laws of the State of Mississippi, do hereby create and establish the Governor's Task Force for Classroom Technology.

I. <u>PURPOSE</u>

The Governor's Task Force for Classroom Technology shall be a time-limited commission with the sole purpose of accomplishing the goal of placing an Internet-accessible computer in every public, elementary and secondary classroom in Mississippi by the end of 2002.

II. MEMBERSHIP

The Task Force shall be co-chaired by the Governor and the State Superintendent of Education.

The Governor shall appoint the following members to serve at the will and pleasure of the Governor:

- a. a representative of Information Technology Services;
- b. a representative of the Public Education Forum;
- c. a representative of the Education Technology Council
- d. a representative of the State Department of Education
- e. a representative of the Mississippi Economic Council
- f. a representative of the Mississippi Association of School Superintendents
- g. a representative of Mississippi Education Television
- h. a representative of the State Parent Teachers Association
- i. a representative of the Governor's Office

- j. three public school teachers
- k. representatives of private foundations and corporations, selected at large by the Governor
- 1. other representatives deemed appropriate by the co-chairs of the Task Force.

III. FUNCTIONS

The Task Force shall be charged with supporting legislative initiatives to finance the project, with pursuing private sector financial support, and with raising public awareness of the project. The Task Force shall also be charged with taking all other action necessary to accomplish the purpose of the Task Force.

IV. COMPENSATION

Members of the Task Force shall receive no compensation for service on the Task Force and shall receive per diem and reimbursement for actual expenses to the extent allowed by specific legislation.

This Executive Order shall take effect immediately and shall continue in effect until rescinded.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 830

WHEREAS, the State of Mississippi has been and will continue to be adversely affected by extreme forest wildfire danger beginning February 25, 2000, and as a result thereof severe wildfire conditions and forest fires are occurring over wide areas of Mississippi causing damage to public and private property timberland; and

WHEREAS, the Mississippi Forestry Commission has requested the imposition of a statewide open burning ban to cope with said disaster.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-3-301, et. seq., Mississippi Code of 1972, as amended do hereby declare a statewide ban of all outdoor open burning. The State Forester as the representative of the Mississippi Forestry Commission has the authority to lift the burning ban as weather and fire danger conditions permit, and the State Forester as the representative of the Mississippi Forestry Commission has the authority to lift the burning ban in local areas as local weather and fire danger conditions permit.

IN ADDITION, all other state and local entities of government are directed to cooperate with the State Forestry Commission and the Mississippi Emergency Management Commission to accomplish the purposes of this Executive Order.

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 829

WHEREAS, conditions exist and are expected to exist in the State of Mississippi as a result of the severe winter weather and other disasters, of such grave nature as to result in imminent danger of loss of life and property; and

WHEREAS, civil authorities have requested the support of the Mississippi National Guard to cope with said disasters.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Musgrove, Governor of the State of Mississippi, pursuant to the authority vested in me by Section 119 and Section 217, Mississippi Constitution of 1890, and Sections 7-1-5, 33-3-301, and 33-7-305, Mississippi Code of 1972, do hereby direct Brigadier General George H. Walker, Adjutant General of the Mississippi National Guard, to order out such officers and enlisted personnel of the Mississippi National Guard as he deems necessary and requisite and for such duration as he deems appropriate to assist civil authorities in the areas affected by the severe winter weather and other disasters. Brigadier General Walker will be in direct command of the troops ordered to active duty and will use such equipment as may be found necessary in his opinion to accomplish the mission of the National Guard troops. The number of troops used and the amount of expense incurred will be held to a minimum compatible with the mission to be performed.

The members of the Mississippi National Guard ordered to active duty under the provisions of this Order shall be subject to the provisions, privileges, and immunities of the statutes of the State of Mississippi governing the National Guard and the State Militia where applicable.

In addition, the pay and expenses of the troops ordered to State Active Duty will be paid as provided in Section 33-15-307 4(g), The Mississippi Emergency Act of 1995, Mississippi Code of 1972.
