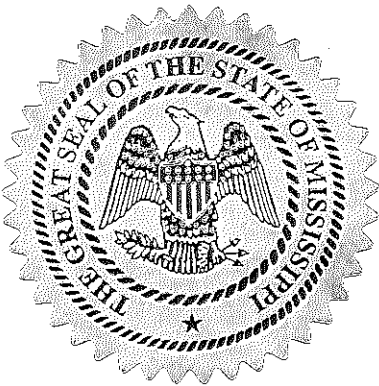
WHEREAS, Robert Henderson, Mississippi Department of Corrections No. 98630, was sentenced on December 5, 1997 in Hinds County, Mississippi under Cause Number 96-2-003, and on November 21, 1997 under the same cause number on a charge of Receiving Stolen Property and Possession of Cocaine; and,

WHEREAS, Robert Henderson, was sentenced on May 6, 1992 in Hinds County, Mississippi under Cause No. 92-1-90 for Possession of Cocaine, in Cause No. 90-2-376 on September 6, 1991 for Receiving Stolen Property, and on May 26, 1992 in Hinds County, Mississippi, under Cause No. 91-1-143 for Receiving Stolen Property; and

WHEREAS, Robert Henderson was discharged from probation on March 4, 2002; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Haley Barbour, Governor of the State of Mississippi, under and by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution and Laws of this State, do hereby grant to Robert Henderson a full, complete, and unconditional pardon for the crimes and convictions named herein; and henceforth, shall be absolved from all legal consequences of these crimes and convictions.

I do authorize and direct you, upon receipt of this Executive Order, to take notice and be governed accordingly.
